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ORDER:-

The Commissioner of Technical Education, Andhra Pradesh, Hyderabad is informed that the issue of implementing reservations to Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes/Backward Classes in Engineering Admissions has been examined in detail in the light of the judgement of the Supreme Court in Ritesh R. Shah Vs Dr.Y.L.Yamul AIR 1996 SC 1378 which was relied by the High Court of Andhra Pradesh in its judgement, dated 23-2-2000 in W.P.No. 26404 of 1999 & W.A.No. 795/2000 and batch and also in consultation with Backward Classes Welfare Department. The Legislature Committee on Welfare of Backward Classes, in its meeting held on 24-01-2001 has also discussed about the procedure adopted for the implementation of Backward Classes reservations for admission in Engineering Colleges and other professional courses and observed that the same procedure be adopted as followed in the admissions in the M.B.B.S. course. Besides this, there are certain representations from Backward Classes Welfare Association requesting to follow the judgement of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Ritesh Shah's case in Engineering admissions and to implement the rule of reservation for Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/Backward Classes in true spirit.

2. The Andhra Pradesh Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission into Under-graduate Professional courses through Common Entrance Test) Rules, 1993, issued in G.O.Ms.No. 184 Education dated 20-08-1993 stipulate the following reservations, namely:-

- (i) SC's 15%
- (ii) ST's 6%
- (iii) BC's 25% and shall be allocated among the four groups of Backward Classes as follows:-
 - i) Group A - 7%
 - ii) Group B - 10%
 - iii) Group C - 1%
 - iv) Group D - 7%

3. In the case of 'Ritesh R.Shah Vs. Dr.Y.L.Yamul and others' (A.I.R. 1996 S.C. 1378) the Supreme Court held as follows:-

"A student who is entitled to be admitted on the basis of merit though belonging to a reserved category cannot be considered to be admitted against seats reserved for reserved category. But at the same time the provisions should be so made that it will not work out to the disadvantage of such candidate and he may not be placed at a more disadvantageous position than the other less meritorious reserved category candidates. The aforesaid objective can be achieved if after finding out the candidates from amongst the reserved category who would otherwise come in the open merit list and then asking their option for admission into the different colleges which have been kept reserved for reserved category and there after the cases of less meritorious reserved category candidates should be considered and they will be allotted seats in whichever colleges the seats should be available." In other words, while a reserved category candidate entitled to admission on the basis of his merit will have the option of taking admission in the colleges where a specified number of seats have been kept reserved for reserved category but while computing the percentage of reservation he will be deemed to have been admitted as an open category candidate and not as a reserved category candidate.

4. Keeping in view of the judgement of the Supreme Court, the High Court in its order dated 23.2.2000 in batch of W.P. Nos. including

W.P.No. 26404 of 1999 and W.A.No. 795 of 1999 relating to MBBS admissions made by the NTR University of Health Sciences has ordered to fix the meritorious SC, ST & BC category students strictly in order of merit for the general seats adhering to the principles laid down by the Supreme Court in the Ritesh R.Shah's Case and accommodate meritorious students belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe and Backward Classes students by deleting the other students allotted in the open competition from the list and resultant equal number of vacancies shall be filled up by drawing the other meritorious candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe and Backward Classes communities who will be next eligible. Therefore, it is clear that the resultant vacancies shall be filled by the students belonging to the respective reservation categories only.

5 After careful consideration and due examination of the issue relating to implementation of reservation for Schedule Caste/Schedule Tribe and Backward Classes in Engineering and other Professional Courses the following instructions are hereby issued.

- (i) In the counselling process, the seats to be filled by open competition should be filled up first, wherein the candidates should be called for counselling based on merit alone irrespective of whether they belong to S.C., ST or B.C. in accordance with the instructions issued by the Government in G.O.Ms.No. 996, Employment & Social Welfare, dated:11th November, 1975.
- (ii) Next, reservation categories like SC/ST/BC candidates will be counselled to fill up the seats earmarked for them in their respective categories. During this process, if a candidate belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/Backward Classes who had taken admission under open competition, opts for a better branch or a better college of his choice for which he or she would be eligible as per the rules of reservation, the seat vacated by him or her in open competition shall be filled with a candidate from the same reservation category only, in order of merit.

6. Necessary amendments to the Andhra Pradesh Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions into Under-Graduate Professional Courses through Common Entrance Test) Rules, 1993 issued in G.O.Ms.No.184, Education dt.20-8-1993 shall be issued separately

7. The Commissioner of Technical Education, Andhra Pradesh/ the Chairman, A.P. State Council for Higher Education, shall take further action to follow the above instructions, in implementing the rule of reservation to SC/ST/BCs in admissions of Engineering, B.Arch., B.Pharmacy and other professional courses through Common Entrance tests. The Commissioner of Technical Education shall send necessary proposals for amendment of the said rules at the earliest.

In exercise of the powers conferred by sub section (1) of section 7 of the Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Castes (Rationalisation of Reservations) Ordinance, 1999 (A.P.Ordinance 6 of 1999) the Governor of Andhra Pradesh hereby makes the following Rules namely :-

Rules :-

Short title and
commencement :

1. (1) These rules may be called the Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Castes (Rationalisation of Reservations) Rules, 1999.
(2) It shall come into force from the date of publication in the Andhra Pradesh Gazette.

Definitions

2. In these rules unless the context otherwise requires,
 - (a) "Ordinance" means the Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Castes (Rationalisation of Reservations) Ordinance, 1999
 - (b) "educational institution" shall have the meaning assigned to it in clause (c) of section 2 of the Andhra Pradesh Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Prohibition of Capitation Fee) Act, 1983 (AP Act 5 of 1983)
 - (c) 'Government' means the State Government of Andhra Pradesh
 - (d) 'Public Service' means , services in any office or establishment of,
 - (i) the Government
 - (ii) a local authority i.e.,
 - a) a Gram Panchayat or a Mandal Parishad or a Zilla Parishad established under the Andhra Pradesh Panchayat Raj Act,

1994.

- b) a Municipality constituted under the Andhra Pradesh Municipalities Act, 1965 and
 - c) a Municipal Corporation established under the relevant law, for the time being in force, relating to Municipal Corporations;
 - iii) a Corporation or undertaking wholly owned or controlled by Government.
 - iv) a body established under any law made by the Legislature of the State whether incorporated or not including a University and
 - v) any other body established by the Government or by a Society registered under any law relating to the registration of societies for the time being in force and receiving funds from the State Government either fully or partly, for its maintenance or any educational institution, whether registered or not, but receiving aid from the Government;
- e) 'Rule of Reservation' means any rule or provision for reservation of appointments or posts in public service in the special rules applicable to any particular service or the General Rules of the Andhra Pradesh State and Subordinate Service Rules, as the case may be or any rule or provision for reservation of seats in the rules or instructions for admission into educational institutions, as the case may be, in favour of Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes or Backward Classes or Women.
- f) 'Scheduled Castes shall have the meaning assigned to it in clause (24) of article 366 of the Constitution of India.

Procedure for implementation of the rule of reservation

3. In order to implement the rule of reservation under section 3 of the Ordinance

- (1) One percent of the seats both in public appointments or posts and admissions to educational institutions shall be reserved for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes referred to in Clause (a) of Section 3 of the Ordinance.

Provided that in the case of reservation of appointments or posts it shall be allotted to Sl.No.2 of the roster as specified in rule (22) (e) of the Andhra Pradesh State and Subordinate Service Rules 1996.

- (2) seven percent of the seats both in public appointments or posts and admissions to educational institutions shall be reserved for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes referred to in clause (b) of Section 3 of the Ordinance;

Provided that in the case of reservation of appointments or posts it shall be allotted to Sl.No.7,22,41,62,72,87 and 97 of the roster as specified in rule 22(e) of the Andhra Pradesh State

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and Subordinate Service Rules 1996.

(3) six percent of the seats both in public appointments or posts and admissions to educational institutions shall be reserved for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes referred to in clause (c) of Section 3 of the Ordinance;

Provided that in the case of reservation of appointments or posts it shall be allotted to Sl.No.16,27,47,66,77 and 91 of the roster as specified in rule 22 (e) of the Andhra Pradesh State and Subordinate Service Rules, 1996;

(4) one percent of the seats both in public appointments of posts and admissions to educational institutions shall be reserved for the persons belonging to the scheduled castes referred to in clause (d) of section 3 of the Ordinance;

Provided that in the case of reservation of appointments or posts it shall be allotted to Sl.No.52 of the roster as specified in rule 22(e) of the Andhra Pradesh State and subordinate Service Rules, 1996.

Reservation for women

4. The reservation for women to an extent of 33 1/3% provided in public services in each roster cycle of 100 points fixed shall be adjusted by allotting two seats for Scheduled Castes-B and two seats to Scheduled Castes-C and one seat alternately for Scheduled Castes-A and one seat to Scheduled Castes-D as specified in Section 3 of the Ordinance.

Non-availability of eligible candidates

5. (1) if eligible candidates for public appointments or posts are not available to fill the slots reserved for them in the roster points as specified in rule 3 it shall be filled in by the candidates belonging to the next group of the Scheduled Castes communities as specified in Section 3 of the Ordinance.

Note :- If an eligible candidate of Scheduled Castes-A is not available, the roster point may be filled by a candidate Scheduled Castes-B and so on and so forth. In the case of women candidates also in the roster point fixed for Scheduled Castes-A (woman), if an eligible woman candidate is not available , the roster point may be filled by a women candidate belonging to the Scheduled Castes-B group and so on and so forth.

(2) If eligible candidate for admission to educational institutions are not available to fill up the seats as specified in rule 3 it shall be filled in by the candidate belonging to the next group of Scheduled Caste communities.

Carry forward of vacancies

6. If no eligible Scheduled Caste Candidate (including woman candidate) belonging to any of the Scheduled

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Castes referred to in clauses (a), (b), (c) and (d) of Section 3 of the Ordinance is available then the vacancy shall be carried forward and shall not be filled by a candidate belonging to any other community other than the Scheduled Castes in accordance with the rules or the instructions issued by the Government in this regard.

Applicability of the rules in educational institutions

7. These Rules shall be made applicable in all the educational institutions under the control of the State Government, wherever rule of reservation is applicable

Non-applicability of the rules in public appointments/admissions

8. (1) in the case of public appointments for the filling up of backlog vacancies or regular vacancies to be filled by Scheduled Caste Candidates, Pursuant to various Government instructions issued in this regard from time to time, and where the selection process has been completed and appointment orders have been dispatched or the applicant has been intimated officially that he or she has been intimated officially that has selected and should await posting orders, these rules shall not be made applicable.

2. Similarly, in the case of admissions into educational institutions wherever the admissions have been finalised and the applicant has been intimated officially that he or she has been selected for admission, these rules shall not be made applicable.

Applicability of the rules in case of various stages of the selection/admission process

9. (1) Wherever the selection process for filling up the backlog vacancies or regular vacancies are at various stages, such as (a) the vacancies have been notified (b) the applications have been received (c) the call letters have been sent to applicants to appear for written test or or interview or both; (d) the written tests or interview or both have been completed but the appointment orders have not been dispatched or selection has not been intimated to applicants, in such cases the appointing authorities shall follow the procedure as specified in rule 3 and 4 of these rules.

(2) Similarly, in the case of admission into educational institutions wherever the selection process for admission is at various stages such as (a) vacancies have been notified (b) applications have been received (c) the applicants have been asked to appear for any written test and interview or counseling (d) the written test and interview or counseling have been completed but the admissions have not been intimated to the applicants, in such cases the admissions shall be completed following the rule of reservation as specified in rule 3 and 4 of these rules.

Applicability of the rules in future appointments/admissions to educational institutions

These rules shall be made applicable to all public appointments and admissions to educational institutions from the date of commencement of these rules wherever rule of reservation is applicable.

BACKWARD CLASSES WELFARE DEPARTMENT - Guidelines for Implementation of 10% Reservation to the Economically Weaker Sections for admissions into Educational Institutions for the academic year 2019-20 - Orders - Issued.

ORDER:

The Government of India, in the reference 1st read above, has brought out the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019 inserting Clauses 15 (6) and 16 (6) in the Constitution providing for 10% reservation in admissions into Educational Institutions and appointments to posts in favour of Economically Weaker Sections of citizens other than the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes.

2 In pursuance of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019, the Government of India have, in the reference 2nd read above, prescribed the eligibility criteria to get the benefit of 10% reservation in admissions into Educational Institutions and appointments to posts provided in favour of Economically Weaker Sections of citizens other than the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes among others which are as follows:

- 1) The persons who are not covered under existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes and whose gross annual family income is below Rs.8.00 lakh are to be identified as EWS for the benefit of reservation.
- 2) The persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS for the benefit of reservation, irrespective of the family income.

- i. Five (5) Acres of agricultural land and above.
- ii. Residential flat of 1000 Sq. ft. and above.
- iii. Residential plot of 100 Sq. Yards and above in notified Municipalities / Corporations.
- iv. Residential plot of 200 Sq. Yards and above in areas other than notified Municipalities / Corporations.

The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.

The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who seeks benefit of reservation, his/her parents and siblings below the age of 18 years as also his/her spouse and children below the age of 18 years.

3. After passing of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019, the Government of Andhra Pradesh have bifurcated the 10% reservation and brought out two Acts, namely, Act No.14 of 2019, Dated:20.02.2019 and Act No.15 of 2019, Dated:20.02.2019, providing for 5% reservation to Economically Weaker Sections among Kapus and 5% reservation to Economically Weaker Sections among other than Kapus respectively, towards admissions into Educational Institutions and appointments to posts in the Public Services under the State. There shall be 1/3rd horizontal reservation for women within in the reservation provided both to Kapus and other than Kapus.

4. In the reference 4th read above, the Government have issued orders bringing the provisions of the Act 14 of 2019 and Act 15 of 2019 into force with effect from 08.03.2019.

5. In the reference 5th read above, Government have constituted a Committee for formulation of draft guidelines for implementation of 5% reservation provided to Economically Weaker Sections among Kapus and 5% reservation provided to Economically Weaker Sections other than Kapus.

6. Meanwhile, a Writ Petition bearing No. WP (CIVIL) No. 343 OF 2019 with I.A.NO. 45038/2019 has been filed before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India praying for quashing the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019 as violative of basic structure of the Constitution and also quashing Act 14 & Act 15 of 2019 enacted by Government of Andhra Pradesh as being violative of Articles 15 (1) & 16 (2) of the Constitution.

7. In the reference 7th & 8th read above, two Writ Petitions have been filed before the Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh praying for issuing an appropriate Writ or Order or direction more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus to the respondents to notify the Rules for implementing the 10% reservation provided to Economically Weaker Sections among Kapus and other than Kapus in Act No.14 of 2019 and Act No.15 of 2019 enacted by the State of Andhra Pradesh.

8. In the reference 9th read above, one more Writ Petition has been filed before the Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh praying for issuing an appropriate Writ or Order or direction more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus declaring Act No.14 of 2019 and Act No.15 of 2019 as ultra vires and un-constitutional, violative of the purport of the 103rd Constitutional Amendment Act, 2019 and violative of Article 15 of the Constitution of India and consequently, Act No.14 of 2019 and Act No.15 of 2019, have to be struck down. The Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh passed the following Interim orders in this case:

"Notice before admission.

Petitioners filed the Writ Petition seeking Mandamus declaring Act 14 and Act 15 of 2019, as ultra vires, unconstitutional, violative of the purport of the 103rd Constitutional Amendment, violative of

Article 15 of the Constitution of India and consequently to strike down Act 14 and Act 15 of 2019.

Petitioners also sought interim relief, to direct the Respondents 6 and 7 to follow 103rd Constitutional Amendment Act during admissions into Medical and Engineering Courses and allot seats in the supernumerary seats created by the 4th Respondent, only in accordance with the policy of the 4th Respondent, with regard to Economically Weaker Sections, pending disposal of the writ petition.

It is the case of the petitioners that Act 14 and Act 15 of 2019, creating reservation in Educational Institutions to Kapu community based on their economic backwardness, is contrary to the 103rd Amendment.

In fact, it is brought to the notice of the Court that a petition challenging 103rd Constitutional Amendment is pending before the Honourable Supreme Court, but the main contention is that Act 14 and Act 15 are inconsistent with the purport of 103rd Constitutional Amendment. At this stage, it is not possible to decide the core issue i.e. the vires of Act 14 and 15 of 2019, making another class within the original class, without inviting counter-affidavit from the respondents.

Therefore, there shall be a direction to the respondents to complete the admission process, pending further orders, subject to the result of the Writ Petition, by obtaining an undertaking from the petitioners to the effect that in case the petitioners do not succeed in the writ petition, they shall not claim any equities in future based on the admissions.

Post after three weeks, by which time respondents shall file their counter-affidavits".

9. In view of the above Government hereby decided to fill up the EWS quota of supernumerary seats in Higher Educational Institutions in accordance with 103rd Constitutional Amendment Act, 2019 and the guidelines issued by Govt., of India vide Office Memorandum F.No.36039/1/2019-Estt(Res.) Dated: 19.01.2019. The guidelines relevant for current academic year 2019-2020, in regard to the subject matter consistent with 103rd Constitutional Amendment, would read as under:

- i. All Castes which are not covered under any reservation category (SC / ST / BC) are entitled to avail of the reservation facility under EWS Category.
- ii. The students admitted under EWS Category will be adjusted against the 10 percent of the sanctioned seats granted additionally, as is followed by the Government of India. However, 1/3rd (33 1/3) of the seats enhanced for the purpose of accommodating the EWS Category students shall be earmarked to women among them.
- iii. The model format of the EWS Certificate prescribed by Government of India in Annexure-1 vide their O.M.No.36039/1/2019-Estt. (Res), Dated: 31-1-2019 shall be followed along with the conditions referred in para 2 above.
- iv. The persons seeking the benefit of reservation under EWS category shall obtain the necessary EWS Certificate issued by the Tahsildar concerned.
- v. The eligibility conditions for a person to avail of the facility of EWS reservation are the same as fixed by the Government of India as referred in Para 2 above:

10. Further, in regard to implementation of reservations to EWS Category in appointments to the posts or services under State, necessary orders will be issued separately.

11. All the Administrative Departments concerned / Districts Collectors are therefore requested to take necessary action accordingly.

- d) SSC and Intermediate pass certificates
 - e) Two Passport size photographs
 - f) Study certificates from IX class to qualifying examination
 - g) A valid caste certificate in original from the Tahshildar in case of SC/ST/BC candidates OR permanent caste certificate
 - h) Latest Income certificate from the Tahshildar obtained in 2020 (for those who wish to apply for Scholarship/ fee concession). Fee concession will not be given if income certificate is not submitted.
 - i) Relevant certificate in case of physically challenged/extra curricular activities (NCC/NSS/Games & Sports / Cultural Activity) category.
 - j) Discharge certificate and service certificate of the parent in case of a child of armed person.
 - k) Residence Certificate of parents for stay in the state of A.P. from Tahshildar in case of candidates, who have studied outside A.P./ carried out private study.
 - l) Migration certificate (for other University candidates)
- 9.6 **The cases of pending revaluation will not be considered.**

- 9.7 After the announcement of the results, qualified candidates will be called for the admission counseling for the certificate verification to assess the eligibility and other credentials. Provisional seat allotment to the candidates will be given based on the availability of seats and by following the rule of reservation through web counseling. After the provisional seat allotment candidates need to pay the required fee before the stipulated time to get the confirmed allotment letter. If any candidate(s) failed to pay the fee, the seat will be cancelled and it is treated as vacancy and will be filled in successive counseling.
- 9.8 Candidates, who secured admission in the first phase counseling need to pay stipulated course fee and report to the concerned college in order to secure the admission. However, if the candidate is not satisfied with the seat allotted in the first phase, they can attend the second phase counseling. If the candidate gets admission in second phase counseling, the seat allotted in the first phase will gets cancelled. The course fee paid in first phase allotment will be adjusted to the seat secured in second phase counseling.
- 9.9 However, after the first phase of allotment, any candidate who wants to opt for cancellation of admission is allowed to do so at the Convener office with a cancellation fee of 10% of the regular or self- financing fee paid or Rs.500/- whichever is higher until the commencement of the second phase of verification and without refund of fee from the date of commencement of the second phase of verification.
- 9.10 For cancellation of admission after the closing of admissions, the candidate has to pay the total fee for the entire course period without any concession.
- 9.11 All the admissions are purely provisional and the University reserves the right to cancel the admission of a candidate at any stage
- 9.12 The admission shall be made into M.P.Ed. Course on the basis of marks obtained in the Entrance test (Theory), conducted by the University and the achievement in Sports & Games. The Entrance Examination (Theory) will be conducted by the Convener, YVUCET-2020 for 100 marks. The weightage marks of 100 for Sports & Games shall be reckoned based on the highest level he/she has played and certificate produced, on the day of Entrance test. The certificates submitted by the candidate at the time of Entrance test will be subject to verification for the genuineness of the certificate from the issuing authority. There will not be any reservation under ECA quota for Sports & Games for admission into M.P.Ed. Course.
- (a) In-service candidates shall produce Relieving Certificate from the concerned Head of the Institution along with the Permission Certificate from the concerned Authorities.
 - (b) Student should produce Physical Fitness Certificate from Civil Surgeon or Assistant Surgeon (Govt. Doctor) to get eligibility for admission and to pursue the study.

10. LOCAL AND NON-LOCAL CANDIDATES

- 10.1 The Y.V. University area comprises of the districts Anantapur, Chittoor, Kadapa, Kurnool & Nellore.
- 10.2 The following candidates are treated as local to Yogi Vemana University area
- 10.2.1 A candidate who has studied in the Yogi Vemana University area (or stayed in case of private study) for four consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which he/she has first appeared for the final year qualifying examination.
 - 10.2.2. A candidate who has studied (or stayed in case of private study) for seven consecutive academic years within the state of Andhra Pradesh ending with the academic year in which he/she first appeared for the final year qualifying examination and studied (or stayed in case of private study) for a maximum period in the Yogi Vemana University area.
 - 10.2.3. In case a candidate has studied (or stayed in case of private study) for equal periods in the Y.V. University area and another University area out of the last seven years, he/she should have studied (or stayed in case of private study) lastly in the Yogi Vemana University area.
- 10.3 Any candidate who is not local to Yogi Vemana University is treated as non-local to Yogi Vemana University, if
- 10.3.1 he/she is local to any other University in Andhra Pradesh/Telangana State.
 - 10.3.2 he/she resided for a total period of not less than 10 years in Andhra Pradesh/Telangana (excluding the periods of study outside the Andhra Pradesh/Telangana State).
 - 10.3.3 His/her parents has resided in Andhra Pradesh/Telangana for a total period of not less than 10 years.
 - 10.3.4 His/her parent/spouse is presently working in Andhra Pradesh/Telangana in government or allied service.

11. ALLOCATION OF SEATS TO VARIOUS RESERVATION CATEGORIES

- 11.1 The allocation of percentage of seats as detailed below is as per G.O.M.S.No.184, Education (EC-2)

- 11.2 Among the seats sanctioned in each course, 85% of the seats are given to reserved categories of local (L) candidates, while 15% are given to local and non-local candidates (L/NL) on merit.
- 11.3 The 85% reserved seats are filled by local candidates belonging to OC (Open Category), SC (15%), ST (6%), BC-A (7%), BC-B (10%), BC-C (1%), BC-D (7%), BC-E (4%), ECA (Extracurricular activities): NCC/NSS/Sports/Cultural Activities (2.5%), PH (Physically handicapped) (3%) and CAP (Children of armed personnel) (2%).
At any cost the total number of candidates admitted under non-local category should not exceed 15% putting together in all categories of OC, SC, ST, BC, ECA, CAP and PH. However, filling up of 15% of seats with Non-local candidates is not a must in case of non-availability of such candidates.
The University scrupulously follows the reservations in accordance with GOI Policy and the guidelines of the UGC from time to time.
- 11.4 A vacancy under SC goes to ST and vice-versa. If enough SC&ST candidates are not available, the left-over seats reserved for them shall be treated unreserved seats and shall be filled by candidates on merit basis.
- 11.5 29% of seats shall be reserved for the candidates belonging to the Backward Classes and shall be allocated among the following groups of Backward Classes as shown below:
BC-A (7%), BC-B (10%), BC-C (1%), BC-D (7%) and BC-E (4%)
If qualified candidates belonging to Backward Class of a particular group are not available, the leftover seats can be adjusted for the candidates of next group. If qualified candidates belonging to Backward Classes are not available to fill up the 29% seats reserved for them, the left over seats shall be treated as unreserved and shall be filled up with candidates of General Pool.
No candidates seeking reservation for admission under above categories be allowed to participate, in the Counseling for admission unless he/she produces the Integrated Community Certificated prescribed by the Govt. and issued by the Revenue Authorities in the Government (vide G.O. MS. No:58, Social Welfare (J), Dept., Dated: 12-5-1997).
- 11.6 A maximum of 10% of the total seats in each course (Regular/Self Finance) is available under Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) category (as per G. O. Ms No: 39, Dt: 30-07-2019) for the candidates who are not covered under existing scheme of reservations.
- 11.7 For admission into Extracurricular Activities (ECA) seats, participation during the period of study of the qualifying examination is alone considered. The priorities in respect of the special categories mentioned above shall be in accordance with Government Orders issued from time to time.
- 11.8 Expert committees nominated by the University will certify the suitability and priority of the candidates under special categories (ECA/PH/CAP) by following the up-to-date guidelines.
- 11.9 **Reservation for women:** One third of the seats are reserved for women candidates in each category (i.e., OC, SC, ST, BC, ECA, PH and L/NL). This rule is not applied if women candidates selected on merit in a category from one third or more of the seats therein. If there are no suitable women candidates in a category, the seats will be directed to the men candidates of the same category. Absence of adequate number of women candidates in a category cannot be compensated by giving more seats for women in another category.

12. BC-C (1%) SEATS

BC-C allotment will be done taking into consideration of the total seats available in the subject put together under college by adopting rotation system.

13. SPONSORED (SP) SEATS

In addition to the seats available in each department at **Yogi Vemana University College, Kadapa**, an addition of 20% sponsored seats are available and are filled on the submission of sponsored letter from Industry/Organization/others. The particulars of fee will be displayed in the DOA web site at a later date.

14. FEE PARTICULARS

The details of fee to be paid at the time of admission for various PG courses are given in the following table. Admission fee for income certificate holders means fee for candidates who are eligible for fee reimbursement under SC/ST category whose parents' annual income is less than Rs.2,00,000/- and for BC/OC candidates whose parents' annual income is less than Rs.1,00,000/-

If any admitted candidate(s) who cannot get fee reimbursement from the Government he/she has to pay the specified fee to the University immediately, as agreed earlier. In case if government will not reimburse the equivalent fee as specified below, the candidate has to pay the balance fee to the University, as agreed earlier.

Candidates those who called for counseling has to pay an amount of Rs.500/- (Rs.250/- for SC/ST) towards counseling fee.


Other University students have to pay an additional fee of Rs. 250/-.

Income certificate of parent must be taken from Tahsildar in the year 2020.

Computer lab fee of Rs.1,000/- extra for, Economics, and M. Com. courses.

Study tour/media visit fee of Rs. 1000/- extra for M. A. Communication and Journalism course.

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ORDER:-

The Commissioner of Technical Education, Andhra Pradesh, Hyderabad is informed that the issue of implementing reservations to Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes/Backward Classes in Engineering Admissions has been examined in detail in the light of the judgement of the Supreme Court in Ritesh R. Shah Vs Dr.Y.L.Yamul AIR 1996 SC 1378 which was relied by the High Court of Andhra Pradesh in its judgement, dated 23-2-2000 in W.P.No. 26404 of 1999 & W.A.No. 795/2000 and batch and also in consultation with Backward Classes Welfare Department. The Legislature Committee on Welfare of Backward Classes, in its meeting held on 24-01-2001 has also discussed about the procedure adopted for the implementation of Backward Classes reservations for admission in Engineering Colleges and other professional courses and observed that the same procedure be adopted as followed in the admissions in the M.B.B.S. course. Besides this, there are certain representations from Backward Classes Welfare Association requesting to follow the judgement of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Ritesh Shah's case in Engineering admissions and to implement the rule of reservation for Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/Backward Classes in true spirit.

2. The Andhra Pradesh Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission into Under-graduate Professional courses through Common Entrance Test) Rules, 1993, issued in G.O.Ms.No. 184 Education dated 20-08-1993 stipulate the following reservations, namely:-

- (i) SC's 15%
- (ii) ST's 6%
- (iii) BC's 25% and shall be allocated among the four groups of Backward Classes as follows:-
 - i) Group A - 7%
 - ii) Group B - 10%
 - iii) Group C - 1%
 - iv) Group D - 7%

3. In the case of 'Ritesh R. Shah Vs. Dr. Y.L. Yamul and others' (A.I.R. 1996 S.C. 1378) the Supreme Court held as follows:-

"A student who is entitled to be admitted on the basis of merit though belonging to a reserved category cannot be considered to be admitted against seats reserved for reserved category. But at the same time the provisions should be so made that it will not work out to the disadvantage of such candidate and he may not be placed at a more disadvantageous position than the other less meritorious reserved category candidates. The aforesaid objective can be achieved if after finding out the candidates from amongst the reserved category who would otherwise come in the open merit list and then asking their option for admission into the different colleges which have been kept reserved for reserved category and there after the cases of less meritorious reserved category candidates should be considered and they will be allotted seats in whichever colleges the seats should be available." In other words, while a reserved category candidate entitled to admission on the basis of his merit will have the option of taking admission in the colleges where a specified number of seats have been kept reserved for reserved category but while computing the percentage of reservation he will be deemed to have been admitted as an open category candidate and not as a reserved category candidate.

4. Keeping in view of the judgement of the Supreme Court, the High Court in its order dated 23.2.2000 in batch of W.P. Nos. including

Contd. 3.

W.P.No. 26404 of 1999 and W.A.No. 795 of 1999 relating to MBBS admissions made by the NTR University of Health Sciences has ordered to fix the meritorious SC, ST & BC category students strictly in order of merit for the general seats adhering to the principles laid down by the Supreme Court in the Ritesh R.Shah's Case and accommodate meritorious students belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe and Backward Classes students by deleting the other students allotted in the open competition from the list and resultant equal number of vacancies shall be filled up by drawing the other meritorious candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe and Backward Classes communities who will be next eligible. Therefore, it is clear that the resultant vacancies shall be filled by the students belonging to the respective reservation categories only.

5 After careful consideration and due examination of the issue relating to implementation of reservation for Schedule Caste/Schedule Tribe and Backward Classes in Engineering and other Professional Courses the following instructions are hereby issued.

- (i) In the counselling process, the seats to be filled by open competition should be filled up first, wherein the candidates should be called for counselling based on merit alone irrespective of whether they belong to S.C., ST or B.C. in accordance with the instructions issued by the Government in G.O.Ms.No. 996, Employment & Social Welfare, dated: 11th November, 1975.
- (ii) Next, reservation categories like SC/ST/BC candidates will be counselled to fill up the seats earmarked for them in their respective categories. During this process, if a candidate belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/Backward Classes who had taken admission under open competition, opts for a better branch or a better college of his choice for which he or she would be eligible as per the rules of reservation, the seat vacated by him or her in open competition shall be filled with a candidate from the same reservation category only, in order of merit.

6. Necessary amendments to the Andhra Pradesh Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions into Under-Graduate Professional Courses through Common Entrance Test) Rules, 1993 issued in G.O.Ms.No.184, Education dt.20-8-1993 shall be issued separately

7. The Commissioner of Technical Education, Andhra Pradesh/ the Chairman, A.P. State Council for Higher Education, shall take further action to follow the above instructions, in implementing the rule of reservation to SC/ST/BCs in admissions of Engineering, B.Arch., B.Pharmacy and other professional courses through Common Entrance tests. The Commissioner of Technical Education shall send necessary proposals for amendment of the said rules at the earliest.

In exercise of the powers conferred by sub section (1) of section 7 of the Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Castes (Rationalisation of Reservations) Ordinance, 1999 (A.P.Ordinance 6 of 1999) the Governor of Andhra Pradesh hereby makes the following Rules namely :-

Rules :-

Short title and
commencement :

1. (1) These rules may be called the Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Castes (Rationalisation of Reservations) Rules, 1999.
(2) It shall come into force from the date of publication in the Andhra Pradesh Gazette.

Definitions

2. In these rules unless the context otherwise requires,
 - (a) "Ordinance" means the Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Castes (Rationalisation of Reservations) Ordinance, 1999
 - (b) "educational institution" shall have the meaning assigned to it in clause (c) of section 2 of the Andhra Pradesh Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Prohibition of Capitation Fee) Act, 1983 (AP Act 5 of 1983)
 - (c) 'Government' means the State Government of Andhra Pradesh
 - (d) 'Public Service' means , services in any office or establishment of,
 - (i) the Government
 - (ii) a local authority i.e.,
 - a) a Gram Panchayat or a Mandal Parishad or a Zilla Parishad established under the Andhra Pradesh Panchayat Raj Act,

1994.

- b) a Municipality constituted under the Andhra Pradesh Municipalities Act, 1965 and
 - c) a Municipal Corporation established under the relevant law, for the time being in force, relating to Municipal Corporations;
 - iii) a Corporation or undertaking wholly owned or controlled by Government.
 - iv) a body established under any law made by the Legislature of the State whether incorporated or not including a University and
 - v) any other body established by the Government or by a Society registered under any law relating to the registration of societies for the time being in force and receiving funds from the State Government either fully or partly, for its maintenance or any educational institution, whether registered or not, but receiving aid from the Government;
- e) 'Rule of Reservation' means any rule or provision for reservation of appointments or posts in public service in the special rules applicable to any particular service or the General Rules of the Andhra Pradesh State and Subordinate Service Rules, as the case may be or any rule or provision for reservation of seats in the rules or instructions for admission into educational institutions, as the case may be, in favour of Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes or Backward Classes or Women.
- f) 'Scheduled Castes shall have the meaning assigned to it in clause (24) of article 366 of the Constitution of India.

Procedure for implementation of the rule of reservation

3. In order to implement the rule of reservation under section 3 of the Ordinance

- (1) One percent of the seats both in public appointments or posts and admissions to educational institutions shall be reserved for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes referred to in Clause (a) of Section 3 of the Ordinance.

Provided that in the case of reservation of appointments or posts it shall be allotted to Sl.No.2 of the roster as specified in rule (22) (e) of the Andhra Pradesh State and Subordinate Service Rules 1996.

- (2) seven percent of the seats both in public appointments or posts and admissions to educational institutions shall be reserved for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes referred to in clause (b) of Section 3 of the Ordinance;

Provided that in the case of reservation of appointments or posts it shall be allotted to Sl.No.7,22,41,62,72,87 and 97 of the roster as specified in rule 22(e) of the Andhra Pradesh State

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and Subordinate Service Rules 1996.

(3) six percent of the seats both in public appointments or posts and admissions to educational institutions shall be reserved for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes referred to in clause (c) of Section 3 of the Ordinance;

Provided that in the case of reservation of appointments or posts it shall be allotted to Sl.No.16,27,47,66,77 and 91 of the roster as specified in rule 22 (e) of the Andhra Pradesh State and Subordinate Service Rules, 1996;

(4) one percent of the seats both in public appointments of posts and admissions to educational institutions shall be reserved for the persons belonging to the scheduled castes referred to in clause (d) of section 3 of the Ordinance;

Provided that in the case of reservation of appointments or posts it shall be allotted to Sl.No.52 of the roster as specified in rule 22(e) of the Andhra Pradesh State and subordinate Service Rules, 1996.

Reservation for women

4. The reservation for women to an extent of 33 1/3% provided in public services in each roster cycle of 100 points fixed shall be adjusted by allotting two seats for Scheduled Castes-B and two seats to Scheduled Castes-C and one seat alternately for Scheduled Castes-A and one seat to Scheduled Castes-D as specified in Section 3 of the Ordinance.

Non-availability of eligible candidates

5. (1) if eligible candidates for public appointments or posts are not available to fill the slots reserved for them in the roster points as specified in rule 3 it shall be filled in by the candidates belonging to the next group of the Scheduled Castes communities as specified in Section 3 of the Ordinance.

Note :- If an eligible candidate of Scheduled Castes-A is not available, the roster point may be filled by a candidate Scheduled Castes-B and so on and so forth. In the case of women candidates also in the roster point fixed for Scheduled Castes-A (woman), if an eligible woman candidate is not available, the roster point may be filled by a women candidate belonging to the Scheduled Castes-B group and so on and so forth.

(2) If eligible candidate for admission to educational institutions are not available to fill up the seats as specified in rule 3 it shall be filled in by the candidate belonging to the next group of Scheduled Caste communities.

Carry forward of vacancies

6. If no eligible Scheduled Caste Candidate (including woman candidate) belonging to any of the Scheduled

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Castes referred to in clauses (a), (b), (c) and (d) of Section 3 of the Ordinance is available then the vacancy shall be carried forward and shall not be filled by a candidate belonging to any other community other than the Scheduled Castes in accordance with the rules or the instructions issued by the Government in this regard.

Applicability of the rules in educational institutions

7. These Rules shall be made applicable in all the educational institutions under the control of the State Government, wherever rule of reservation is applicable

Non-applicability of the rules in public appointments/admissions

8. (1) in the case of public appointments for the filling up of backlog vacancies or regular vacancies to be filled by Scheduled Caste Candidates, Pursuant to various Government instructions issued in this regard from time to time, and where the selection process has been completed and appointment orders have been dispatched or the applicant has been intimated officially that he or she has been intimated officially that has selected and should await posting orders, these rules shall not be made applicable.

2. Similarly, in the case of admissions into educational institutions wherever the admissions have been finalised and the applicant has been intimated officially that he or she has been selected for admission, these rules shall not be made applicable.

Applicability of the rules in case of various stages of the selection/admission process

9. (1) Wherever the selection process for filling up the backlog vacancies or regular vacancies are at various stages, such as (a) the vacancies have been notified (b) the applications have been received (c) the call letters have been sent to applicants to appear for written test or or interview or both; (d) the written tests or interview or both have been completed but the appointment orders have not been dispatched or selection has not been intimated to applicants, in such cases the appointing authorities shall follow the procedure as specified in rule 3 and 4 of these rules.

(2) Similarly, in the case of admission into educational institutions wherever the selection process for admission is at various stages such as (a) vacancies have been notified (b) applications have been received (c) the applicants have been asked to appear for any written test and interview or counseling (d) the written test and interview or counseling have been completed but the admissions have not been intimated to the applicants, in such cases the admissions shall be completed following the rule of reservation as specified in rule 3 and 4 of these rules.

Applicability of the rules in future appointments/admissions to educational institutions

These rules shall be made applicable to all public appointments and admissions to educational institutions from the date of commencement of these rules wherever rule of reservation is applicable.

ORDER:

The Government of India, in the reference 1st read above, has brought out the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019 inserting Clauses 15 (6) and 16 (6) in the Constitution providing for 10% reservation in admissions into Educational Institutions and appointments to posts in favour of Economically Weaker Sections of citizens other than the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes.

2 In pursuance of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019, the Government of India have, in the reference 2nd read above, prescribed the eligibility criteria to get the benefit of 10% reservation in admissions into Educational Institutions and appointments to posts provided in favour of Economically Weaker Sections of citizens other than the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes among others which are as follows:

- 1) The persons who are not covered under existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes and whose gross annual family income is below Rs.8.00 lakh are to be identified as EWS for the benefit of reservation.
- 2) The persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS for the benefit of reservation, irrespective of the family income.

- i. Five (5) Acres of agricultural land and above.
- ii. Residential flat of 1000 Sq. ft. and above.
- iii. Residential plot of 100 Sq. Yards and above in notified Municipalities / Corporations.
- iv. Residential plot of 200 Sq. Yards and above in areas other than notified Municipalities / Corporations.

The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.

The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who seeks benefit of reservation, his/her parents and siblings below the age of 18 years as also his/her spouse and children below the age of 18 years.

3 After passing of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019, the Government of Andhra Pradesh have bifurcated the 10% reservation and brought out two Acts, namely, Act No.14 of 2019, Dated:20.02.2019 and Act No.15 of 2019, Dated:20.02.2019, providing for 5% reservation to Economically Weaker Sections among Kapus and 5% reservation to Economically Weaker Sections among other than Kapus respectively, towards admissions into Educational Institutions and appointments to posts in the Public Services under the State. There shall be 1/3rd horizontal reservation for women within in the reservation provided both to Kapus and other than Kapus.

4 In the reference 4th read above, the Government have issued orders bringing the provisions of the Act 14 of 2019 and Act 15 of 2019 into force with effect from 08.03.2019.

5 In the reference 5th read above, Government have constituted a Committee for formulation of draft guidelines for implementation of 5% reservation provided to Economically Weaker Sections among Kapus and 5% reservation provided to Economically Weaker Sections other than Kapus.

6 Meanwhile, a Writ Petition bearing No. WP (CIVIL) No. 343 OF 2019 with I.A.NO. 45038/2019 has been filed before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India praying for quashing the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019 as violative of basic structure of the Constitution and also quashing Act 14 & Act 15 of 2019 enacted by Government of Andhra Pradesh as being violative of Articles 15 (1) & 16 (2) of the Constitution.

7 In the reference 7th & 8th read above, two Writ Petitions have been filed before the Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh praying for issuing an appropriate Writ or Order or direction more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus to the respondents to notify the Rules for implementing the 10% reservation provided to Economically Weaker Sections among Kapus and other than Kapus in Act No.14 of 2019 and Act No.15 of 2019 enacted by the State of Andhra Pradesh.

8 In the reference 9th read above, one more Writ Petition has been filed before the Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh praying for issuing an appropriate Writ or Order or direction more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus declaring Act No.14 of 2019 and Act No.15 of 2019 as ultra vires and un-constitutional, violative of the purport of the 103rd Constitutional Amendment Act, 2019 and violative of Article 15 of the Constitution of India and consequently, Act No.14 of 2019 and Act No.15 of 2019, have to be struck down. The Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh passed the following Interim orders in this case:

"Notice before admission.

Petitioners filed the Writ Petition seeking Mandamus declaring Act 14 and Act 15 of 2019, as ultra vires, unconstitutional, violative of the purport of the 103rd Constitutional Amendment, violative of

Article 15 of the Constitution of India and consequently to strike down Act 14 and Act 15 of 2019.

Petitioners also sought interim relief, to direct the Respondents 6 and 7 to follow 103rd Constitutional Amendment Act during admissions into Medical and Engineering Courses and allot seats in the supernumerary seats created by the 4th Respondent, only in accordance with the policy of the 4th Respondent, with regard to Economically Weaker Sections, pending disposal of the writ petition.

It is the case of the petitioners that Act 14 and Act 15 of 2019, creating reservation in Educational Institutions to Kapu community based on their economic backwardness, is contrary to the 103rd Amendment.

In fact, it is brought to the notice of the Court that a petition challenging 103rd Constitutional Amendment is pending before the Honourable Supreme Court, but the main contention is that Act 14 and Act 15 are inconsistent with the purport of 103rd Constitutional Amendment. At this stage, it is not possible to decide the core issue i.e. the vires of Act 14 and 15 of 2019, making another class within the original class, without inviting counter-affidavit from the respondents.

Therefore, there shall be a direction to the respondents to complete the admission process, pending further orders, subject to the result of the Writ Petition, by obtaining an undertaking from the petitioners to the effect that in case the petitioners do not succeed in the writ petition, they shall not claim any equities in future based on the admissions.

Post after three weeks, by which time respondents shall file their counter-affidavits".

9. In view of the above Government hereby decided to fill up the EWS quota of supernumerary seats in Higher Educational Institutions in accordance with 103rd Constitutional Amendment Act, 2019 and the guidelines issued by Govt., of India vide Office Memorandum F.No.36039/1/2019-Estt(Res.) Dated: 19.01.2019. The guidelines relevant for current academic year 2019-2020, in regard to the subject matter consistent with 103rd Constitutional Amendment, would read as under:

- i. All Castes which are not covered under any reservation category (SC / ST / BC) are entitled to avail of the reservation facility under EWS Category.
- ii. The students admitted under EWS Category will be adjusted against the 10 percent of the sanctioned seats granted additionally, as is followed by the Government of India. However, 1/3rd (33 1/3) of the seats enhanced for the purpose of accommodating the EWS Category students shall be earmarked to women among them.
- iii. The model format of the EWS Certificate prescribed by Government of India in Annexure-1 vide their O.M.No.36039/1/2019-Estt. (Res), Dated: 31-1-2019 shall be followed along with the conditions referred in para 2 above.
- iv. The persons seeking the benefit of reservation under EWS category shall obtain the necessary EWS Certificate issued by the Tahsildar concerned.
- v. The eligibility conditions for a person to avail of the facility of EWS reservation are the same as fixed by the Government of India as referred in Para 2 above:

10. Further, in regard to implementation of reservations to EWS Category in appointments to the posts or services under State, necessary orders will be issued separately.

11. All the Administrative Departments concerned / Districts Collectors are therefore requested to take necessary action accordingly.

- i) Relevant certificate in case of physically challenged/extra curricular activities (NCC/NSS/Games & Sports / Cultural Activity) category.
- j) Discharge certificate and service certificate of the parent in case of a child of armed person.
- k) Residence Certificate of parents for stay in the state of A.P. from Tahshildar in case of candidates, who have studied outside A.P./ carried out private study.
- l) Migration certificate (for other University candidates)

9.6 The cases of pending revaluation will not be considered.

- 9.7 After the announcement of the results, qualified candidates will be called for the admission counseling for the certificate verification to assess the eligibility and other credentials. Provisional seat allotment to the candidates will be given based on the availability of seats and by following the rule of reservation through web counseling. After the provisional seat allotment candidates need to pay the required fee before the stipulated time to get the confirmed allotment letter. If any candidate(s) failed to pay the fee, the seat will be cancelled and it is treated as vacancy and will be filled in successive counseling.
- 9.8 Candidates, who secured admission in the first phase counseling need to pay stipulated course fee and report to the concerned college in order to secure the admission. However, if the candidate is not satisfied with the seat allotted in the first phase, they can attend the second phase counseling. If the candidate gets admission in second phase counseling, the seat allotted in the first phase will get cancelled. The course fee paid in first phase allotment will be adjusted to the seat secured in second phase counseling.
- 9.9 However, after the first phase of allotment, any candidate who wants to opt for cancellation of admission is allowed to do so at the Convener office with a cancellation fee of 10% of the regular or self- financing fee paid or Rs.500/- whichever is higher until the commencement of the second phase of verification and without refund of fee from the date of commencement of the second phase of verification.
- 9.10 For cancellation of admission after the closing of admissions, the candidate has to pay the total fee for the entire course period without any concession.
- 9.11 All the admissions are purely provisional and the University reserves the right to cancel the admission of a candidate at any stage
- 9.12 The admission shall be made into M.P.Ed. Course on the basis of marks obtained in the Entrance test (Theory), conducted by the University and the achievement in Sports & Games. The Entrance Examination (Theory) will be conducted by the Convener, YVUCET-2019 for 100 marks. The weightage marks of 100 for Sports & Games shall be reckoned based on the highest level he/she has played and certificate produced, on the day of Entrance test. The certificates submitted by the candidate at the time of Entrance test will be subject to verification for the genuineness of the certificate from the issuing authority. There will not be any reservation under ECA quota for Sports & Games for admission into M.P.Ed. Course.
 - (a) In-service candidates shall produce Relieving Certificate from the concerned Head of Institution along with the Permission Certificate from the concerned Authorities.
 - (b) Student should produce Physical Fitness Certificate from Civil Surgeon or Assistant Surgeon (Govt. Doctor) to get eligibility for admission and to pursue the study.


10. LOCAL AND NON-LOCAL CANDIDATES

- 10.1 The Y.V. University area comprises of the districts Anantapur, Chittoor, Kadapa, Kurnool & Nellore.
- 10.2 The following candidates are treated as local to Yogi Vemana University area
 - 10.2.1 A candidate who has studied in the Yogi Vemana University area (or stayed in case of private study) for four consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which he/she has first appeared for the final year qualifying examination.
 - 10.2.2. A candidate who has studied (or stayed in case of private study) for seven consecutive academic years within the state of Andhra Pradesh ending with the academic year in which he/she first appeared for the final year qualifying examination and studied (or stayed in case of private study) for a maximum period in the Yogi Vemana University area.
 - 10.2.3. In case a candidate has studied (or stayed in case of private study) for equal periods in the Y.V. University area and another University area out of the last seven years, he/she should have studied (or stayed in case of private study) lastly in the Yogi Vemana University area.
- 10.3 Any candidate who is not local to Yogi Vemana University is treated as non-local to Yogi Vemana University, if
 - 10.3.1 he/she is local to any other University in Andhra Pradesh/Telangana State.
 - 10.3.2 he/she resided for a total period of not less than 10 years in Andhra Pradesh/Telangana (excluding the periods of study outside the Andhra Pradesh/Telangana State).
 - 10.3.3 His/her parents has resided in Andhra Pradesh/Telangana for a total period of not less than 10 years.
 - 10.3.4 His/her parent/spouse is presently working in Andhra Pradesh/Telangana in government or allied service.

11. ALLOCATION OF SEATS TO VARIOUS RESERVATION CATEGORIES

- 11.1 The allocation of percentage of seats as detailed below is as per G.O.M.S.No.184, Education (EC-2) Department, dt. 20-8-1993, and G.O.M.S.No.116 SW (CV-1) dt. 10-12-1999 as amended up-to-date.
 - 11.2 Among the seats sanctioned in each course, 85% of the seats are given to reserved categories of local (L) candidates, while 15% are given to local and non-local candidates (L/NL) on merit.
 - 11.3 The 85% reserved seats are filled by local candidates belonging to OC (Open Category), SC (15%), ST (6%), BC-A (7%), BC-B (10%), BC-C (1%), BC-D (7%), BC-E (4%), ECA (Extracurricular activities): NCC/NSS/Sports/Cultural Activities (2.5%), PH (Physically handicapped) (3%) and CAP (Children of armed personnel) (2%).
- At any cost the total number of candidates admitted under non-local category should not exceed 15%




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putting together in all categories of OC, SC, ST, BC, ECA, CAP and PH. However, filling up of 15% of seats with Non-local candidates is not a must in case of non-availability of such candidates.

- 11.4 A vacancy under SC goes to ST and vice-versa. If enough SC&ST candidates are not available, the left-over seats reserved for them shall be treated unreserved seats and shall be filled by candidates of general pool.
- 11.5 29% of seats shall be reserved for the candidates belonging to the Backward Classes and shall be allocated among the following groups of Backward Classes as shown below:
BC-A (7%), BC-B (10%), BC-C (1%), BC-D (7%) and BC-E (4%)
If qualified candidates belonging to Backward Class of a particular group are not available, the leftover seats can be adjusted for the candidates of next group. If qualified candidates belonging to Backward Classes are not available to fill up the 29% seats reserved for them, the left over seats shall be treated as unreserved and shall be filled up with candidates of General Pool.
No candidates seeking reservation for admission under above categories be allowed to participate, in the Counseling for admission unless he/she produces the Integrated Community Certificated prescribed by the Govt. and issued by the Revenue Authorities in the Government (vide G.O. MS. No:58, Social Welfare (J), Dept., Dated: 12-5-1997).
- 11.6 For admission into Extracurricular Activities (ECA) seats, participation during the period of study of the qualifying examination is alone considered. The priorities in respect of the special categories mentioned above shall be in accordance with Government Orders issued from time to time.
- 11.7 Expert committees nominated by the University will certify the suitability and priority of the candidates under special categories (ECA/PH/CAP) by following the up-to-date guidelines.
- 11.8 **Reservation for women:** One third of the seats are reserved for women candidates in each category (i.e., OC, SC, ST, BC, ECA, PH and L/NL). This rule is not applied if women candidates selected on merit in a category from one third or more of the seats therein. If there are no suitable women candidates in a category, the seats will be directed to the men candidates of the same category. Absence of adequate number of women candidates in a category cannot be compensated by giving more seats for women in another category.

12. BC-C (1%) SEATS

BC-C allotment will be done taking into consideration of the total seats available in the subject put together under college by adopting rotation system.

13. SPONSORED (SP) SEATS

In addition to the seats available in each department at **Yogi Vemana University College, Kadapa**, an addition of 20% sponsored seats are available and are filled on the submission of sponsored letter from Industry/Organization/others. The particulars of fee will be displayed in the DOA web site at a later date.

14. FEE PARTICULARS

The details of fee to be paid at the time of admission for various PG courses are given in the following table. Admission fee for income certificate holders means fee for candidates who are eligible for fee reimbursement under SC/ST category whose parents' annual income is less than Rs.2,00,000/- and for BC/OC candidates whose parents' annual income is less than Rs.1,00,000/-

If any admitted candidate(s) who cannot get fee reimbursement from the Government he/she has to pay the specified fee to the University immediately, as agreed earlier. In case if government will not reimburse the equivalent fee as specified below, the candidate has to pay the balance fee to the University, as agreed earlier.

Candidates those who called for counseling has to pay an amount of Rs.500/- (Rs.250/- for SC/ST) towards counseling fee.

Other University students have to pay an additional fee of Rs. 250/-.

Income certificate of parent must be taken from Tahsildar in the year 2019.

Computer lab fee of Rs.1,000/- extra for, Economics, and M. Com. courses.

Study tour/media visit fee of Rs. 1000/- extra for M. A. Communication and Journalism course.

ORDER:-

The Commissioner of Technical Education, Andhra Pradesh, Hyderabad is informed that the issue of implementing reservations to Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes/Backward Classes in Engineering Admissions has been examined in detail in the light of the judgement of the Supreme Court in Ritesh R. Shah Vs Dr.Y.L.Yamul AIR 1996 SC 1378 which was relied by the High Court of Andhra Pradesh in its judgement, dated 23-2-2000 in W.P.No. 26404 of 1999 & W.A.No. 795/2000 and batch and also in consultation with Backward Classes Welfare Department. The Legislature Committee on Welfare of Backward Classes, in its meeting held on 24-01-2001 has also discussed about the procedure adopted for the implementation of Backward Classes reservations for admission in Engineering Colleges and other professional courses and observed that the same procedure be adopted as followed in the admissions in the M.B.B.S. course. Besides this, there are certain representations from Backward Classes Welfare Association requesting to follow the judgement of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Ritesh Shah's case in Engineering admissions and to implement the rule of reservation for Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/Backward Classes in true spirit.

2. The Andhra Pradesh Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission into Under-graduate Professional courses through Common Entrance Test) Rules, 1993, issued in G.O.Ms.No. 184 Education dated 20-08-1993 stipulate the following reservations, namely:-

- (i) SC's 15%
- (ii) ST's 6%
- (iii) BC's 25% and shall be allocated among the four groups of Backward Classes as follows:-
 - i) Group A - 7%
 - ii) Group B - 10%
 - iii) Group C - 1%
 - iv) Group D - 7%

3. In the case of 'Ritesh R. Shah Vs. Dr. Y.L. Yamul and others' (A.I.R. 1996 S.C. 1378) the Supreme Court held as follows:-

"A student who is entitled to be admitted on the basis of merit though belonging to a reserved category cannot be considered to be admitted against seats reserved for reserved category. But at the same time the provisions should be so made that it will not work out to the disadvantage of such candidate and he may not be placed at a more disadvantageous position than the other less meritorious reserved category candidates. The aforesaid objective can be achieved if after finding out the candidates from amongst the reserved category who would otherwise come in the open merit list and then asking their option for admission into the different colleges which have been kept reserved for reserved category and there after the cases of less meritorious reserved category candidates should be considered and they will be allotted seats in whichever colleges the seats should be available." In other words, while a reserved category candidate entitled to admission on the basis of his merit will have the option of taking admission in the colleges where a specified number of seats have been kept reserved for reserved category but while computing the percentage of reservation he will be deemed to have been admitted as an open category candidate and not as a reserved category candidate.

4. Keeping in view of the judgement of the Supreme Court, the High Court in its order dated 23.2.2000 in batch of W.P. Nos. including

Contd. 3.

W.P.No. 26404 of 1999 and W.A.No. 795 of 1999 relating to MBBS admissions made by the NTR University of Health Sciences has ordered to fix the meritorious SC, ST & BC category students strictly in order of merit for the general seats adhering to the principles laid down by the Supreme Court in the Ritesh R.Shah's Case and accommodate meritorious students belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe and Backward Classes students by deleting the other students allotted in the open competition from the list and resultant equal number of vacancies shall be filled up by drawing the other meritorious candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe and Backward Classes communities who will be next eligible. Therefore, it is clear that the resultant vacancies shall be filled by the students belonging to the respective reservation categories only.

5 After careful consideration and due examination of the issue relating to implementation of reservation for Schedule Caste/Schedule Tribe and Backward Classes in Engineering and other Professional Courses the following instructions are hereby issued.

- (i) In the counselling process, the seats to be filled by open competition should be filled up first, wherein the candidates should be called for counselling based on merit alone irrespective of whether they belong to S.C., ST or B.C. in accordance with the instructions issued by the Government in G.O.Ms.No. 996, Employment & Social Welfare, dated:11th November, 1975.
- (ii) Next, reservation categories like SC/ST/BC candidates will be counselled to fill up the seats earmarked for them in their respective categories. During this process, if a candidate belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/Backward Classes who had taken admission under open competition, opts for a better branch or a better college of his choice for which he or she would be eligible as per the rules of reservation, the seat vacated by him or her in open competition shall be filled with a candidate from the same reservation category only, in order of merit.

6. Necessary amendments to the Andhra Pradesh Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions into Under-Graduate Professional Courses through Common Entrance Test) Rules, 1993 issued in G.O.Ms.No.184, Education dt.20-8-1993 shall be issued separately

7. The Commissioner of Technical Education, Andhra Pradesh/ the Chairman, A.P. State Council for Higher Education, shall take further action to follow the above instructions, in implementing the rule of reservation to SC/ST/BCs in admissions of Engineering, B.Arch., B.Pharmacy and other professional courses through Common Entrance tests. The Commissioner of Technical Education shall send necessary proposals for amendment of the said rules at the earliest.

In exercise of the powers conferred by sub section (1) of section 7 of the Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Castes (Rationalisation of Reservations) Ordinance, 1999 (A.P.Ordinance 6 of 1999) the Governor of Andhra Pradesh hereby makes the following Rules namely :-

Rules :-

Short title and
commencement :

1. (1) These rules may be called the Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Castes (Rationalisation of Reservations) Rules, 1999.
(2) It shall come into force from the date of publication in the Andhra Pradesh Gazette.

Definitions

2. In these rules unless the context otherwise requires,
 - (a) "Ordinance" means the Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Castes (Rationalisation of Reservations) Ordinance, 1999
 - (b) "educational institution" shall have the meaning assigned to it in clause (c) of section 2 of the Andhra Pradesh Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Prohibition of Capitation Fee) Act, 1983 (AP Act 5 of 1983)
 - (c) 'Government' means the State Government of Andhra Pradesh
 - (d) 'Public Service' means , services in any office or establishment of,
 - (i) the Government
 - (ii) a local authority i.e.,
 - a) a Gram Panchayat or a Mandal Parishad or a Zilla Parishad established under the Andhra Pradesh Panchayat Raj Act,

1994.

- b) a Municipality constituted under the Andhra Pradesh Municipalities Act, 1965 and
 - c) a Municipal Corporation established under the relevant law, for the time being in force, relating to Municipal Corporations;
 - iii) a Corporation or undertaking wholly owned or controlled by Government.
 - iv) a body established under any law made by the Legislature of the State whether incorporated or not including a University and
 - v) any other body established by the Government or by a Society registered under any law relating to the registration of societies for the time being in force and receiving funds from the State Government either fully or partly, for its maintenance or any educational institution, whether registered or not, but receiving aid from the Government;
- e) 'Rule of Reservation' means any rule or provision for reservation of appointments or posts in public service in the special rules applicable to any particular service or the General Rules of the Andhra Pradesh State and Subordinate Service Rules, as the case may be or any rule or provision for reservation of seats in the rules or instructions for admission into educational institutions, as the case may be, in favour of Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes or Backward Classes or Women.
- f) 'Scheduled Castes shall have the meaning assigned to it in clause (24) of article 366 of the Constitution of India.

Procedure for implementation of the rule of reservation

3. In order to implement the rule of reservation under section 3 of the Ordinance

- (1) One percent of the seats both in public appointments or posts and admissions to educational institutions shall be reserved for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes referred to in Clause (a) of Section 3 of the Ordinance.

Provided that in the case of reservation of appointments or posts it shall be allotted to Sl.No.2 of the roster as specified in rule (22) (e) of the Andhra Pradesh State and Subordinate Service Rules 1996.

- (2) seven percent of the seats both in public appointments or posts and admissions to educational institutions shall be reserved for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes referred to in clause (b) of Section 3 of the Ordinance;

Provided that in the case of reservation of appointments or posts it shall be allotted to Sl.No.7,22,41,62,72,87 and 97 of the roster as specified in rule 22(e) of the Andhra Pradesh State

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and Subordinate Service Rules 1996.

(3) six percent of the seats both in public appointments or posts and admissions to educational institutions shall be reserved for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes referred to in clause (c) of Section 3 of the Ordinance;

Provided that in the case of reservation of appointments or posts it shall be allotted to Sl.No.16,27,47,66,77 and 91 of the roster as specified in rule 22 (e) of the Andhra Pradesh State and Subordinate Service Rules, 1996;

(4) one percent of the seats both in public appointments of posts and admissions to educational institutions shall be reserved for the persons belonging to the scheduled castes referred to in clause (d) of section 3 of the Ordinance;

Provided that in the case of reservation of appointments or posts it shall be allotted to Sl.No.52 of the roster as specified in rule 22(e) of the Andhra Pradesh State and subordinate Service Rules, 1996.

Reservation for women

4. The reservation for women to an extent of 33 1/3% provided in public services in each roster cycle of 100 points fixed shall be adjusted by allotting two seats for Scheduled Castes-B and two seats to Scheduled Castes-C and one seat alternately for Scheduled Castes-A and one seat to Scheduled Castes-D as specified in Section 3 of the Ordinance.

Non-availability of eligible candidates

5. (1) if eligible candidates for public appointments or posts are not available to fill the slots reserved for them in the roster points as specified in rule 3 it shall be filled in by the candidates belonging to the next group of the Scheduled Castes communities as specified in Section 3 of the Ordinance.

Note :- If an eligible candidate of Scheduled Castes-A is not available, the roster point may be filled by a candidate Scheduled Castes-B and so on and so forth. In the case of women candidates also in the roster point fixed for Scheduled Castes-A (woman), if an eligible woman candidate is not available , the roster point may be filled by a women candidate belonging to the Scheduled Castes-B group and so on and so forth.

(2) If eligible candidate for admission to educational institutions are not available to fill up the seats as specified in rule 3 it shall be filled in by the candidate belonging to the next group of Scheduled Caste communities.

Carry forward of vacancies

6. If no eligible Scheduled Caste Candidate (including woman candidate) belonging to any of the Scheduled

ORDER:

The Government of India, in the reference 1st read above, has brought out the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019 inserting Clauses 15 (6) and 16 (6) in the Constitution providing for 10% reservation in admissions into Educational Institutions and appointments to posts in favour of Economically Weaker Sections of citizens other than the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes.

2. In pursuance of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019, the Government of India have, in the reference 2nd read above, prescribed the eligibility criteria to get the benefit of 10% reservation in admissions into Educational Institutions and appointments to posts provided in favour of Economically Weaker Sections of citizens other than the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes among others which are as follows:

- 1) The persons who are not covered under existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes and whose gross annual family income is below Rs.8.00 lakh are to be identified as EWS for the benefit of reservation.
- 2) The persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS for the benefit of reservation, irrespective of the family income.

- i. Five (5) Acres of agricultural land and above.
- ii. Residential flat of 1000 Sq. ft. and above.
- iii. Residential plot of 100 Sq. Yards and above in notified Municipalities / Corporations.
- iv. Residential plot of 200 Sq. Yards and above in areas other than notified Municipalities / Corporations.

The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.

The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who seeks benefit of reservation, his/her parents and siblings below the age of 18 years as also his/her spouse and children below the age of 18 years.

3 After passing of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019, the Government of Andhra Pradesh have bifurcated the 10% reservation and brought out two Acts, namely, Act No.14 of 2019, Dated:20.02.2019 and Act No.15 of 2019, Dated:20.02.2019, providing for 5% reservation to Economically Weaker Sections among Kapus and 5% reservation to Economically Weaker Sections among other than Kapus respectively, towards admissions into Educational Institutions and appointments to posts in the Public Services under the State. There shall be 1/3rd horizontal reservation for women within in the reservation provided both to Kapus and other than Kapus.

4 In the reference 4th read above, the Government have issued orders bringing the provisions of the Act 14 of 2019 and Act 15 of 2019 into force with effect from 08.03.2019.

5 In the reference 5th read above, Government have constituted a Committee for formulation of draft guidelines for implementation of 5% reservation provided to Economically Weaker Sections among Kapus and 5% reservation provided to Economically Weaker Sections other than Kapus.

6 Meanwhile, a Writ Petition bearing No. WP (CIVIL) No. 343 OF 2019 with I.A.NO. 45038/2019 has been filed before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India praying for quashing the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019 as violative of basic structure of the Constitution and also quashing Act 14 & Act 15 of 2019 enacted by Government of Andhra Pradesh as being violative of Articles 15 (1) & 16 (2) of the Constitution.

7 In the reference 7th & 8th read above, two Writ Petitions have been filed before the Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh praying for issuing an appropriate Writ or Order or direction more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus to the respondents to notify the Rules for implementing the 10% reservation provided to Economically Weaker Sections among Kapus and other than Kapus in Act No.14 of 2019 and Act No.15 of 2019 enacted by the State of Andhra Pradesh.

8 In the reference 9th read above, one more Writ Petition has been filed before the Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh praying for issuing an appropriate Writ or Order or direction more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus declaring Act No.14 of 2019 and Act No.15 of 2019 as ultra vires and un-constitutional, violative of the purport of the 103rd Constitutional Amendment Act, 2019 and violative of Article 15 of the Constitution of India and consequently, Act No.14 of 2019 and Act No.15 of 2019, have to be struck down. The Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh passed the following Interim orders in this case:

"Notice before admission.

Petitioners filed the Writ Petition seeking Mandamus declaring Act 14 and Act 15 of 2019, as ultra vires, unconstitutional, violative of the purport of the 103rd Constitutional Amendment, violative of

Article 15 of the Constitution of India and consequently to strike down Act 14 and Act 15 of 2019.

Petitioners also sought interim relief, to direct the Respondents 6 and 7 to follow 103rd Constitutional Amendment Act during admissions into Medical and Engineering Courses and allot seats in the supernumerary seats created by the 4th Respondent, only in accordance with the policy of the 4th Respondent, with regard to Economically Weaker Sections, pending disposal of the writ petition.

It is the case of the petitioners that Act 14 and Act 15 of 2019, creating reservation in Educational Institutions to Kapu community based on their economic backwardness, is contrary to the 103rd Amendment.

In fact, it is brought to the notice of the Court that a petition challenging 103rd Constitutional Amendment is pending before the Honourable Supreme Court, but the main contention is that Act 14 and Act 15 are inconsistent with the purport of 103rd Constitutional Amendment. At this stage, it is not possible to decide the core issue i.e. the vires of Act 14 and 15 of 2019, making another class within the original class, without inviting counter-affidavit from the respondents.

Therefore, there shall be a direction to the respondents to complete the admission process, pending further orders, subject to the result of the Writ Petition, by obtaining an undertaking from the petitioners to the effect that in case the petitioners do not succeed in the writ petition, they shall not claim any equities in future based on the admissions.

Post after three weeks, by which time respondents shall file their counter-affidavits".

9. In view of the above Government hereby decided to fill up the EWS quota of supernumerary seats in Higher Educational Institutions in accordance with 103rd Constitutional Amendment Act, 2019 and the guidelines issued by Govt., of India vide Office Memorandum F.No.36039/1/2019-Estt(Res.) Dated: 19.01.2019. The guidelines relevant for current academic year 2019-2020, in regard to the subject matter consistent with 103rd Constitutional Amendment, would read as under:

- i. All Castes which are not covered under any reservation category (SC / ST / BC) are entitled to avail of the reservation facility under EWS Category.
- ii. The students admitted under EWS Category will be adjusted against the 10 percent of the sanctioned seats granted additionally, as is followed by the Government of India. However, 1/3rd (33 1/3) of the seats enhanced for the purpose of accommodating the EWS Category students shall be earmarked to women among them.
- iii. The model format of the EWS Certificate prescribed by Government of India in Annexure-1 vide their O.M.No.36039/1/2019-Estt. (Res), Dated: 31-1-2019 shall be followed along with the conditions referred in para 2 above.
- iv. The persons seeking the benefit of reservation under EWS category shall obtain the necessary EWS Certificate issued by the Tahsildar concerned.
- v. The eligibility conditions for a person to avail of the facility of EWS reservation are the same as fixed by the Government of India as referred in Para 2 above:

10. Further, in regard to implementation of reservations to EWS Category in appointments to the posts or services under State, necessary orders will be issued separately.

11. All the Administrative Departments concerned / Districts Collectors are therefore requested to take necessary action accordingly.

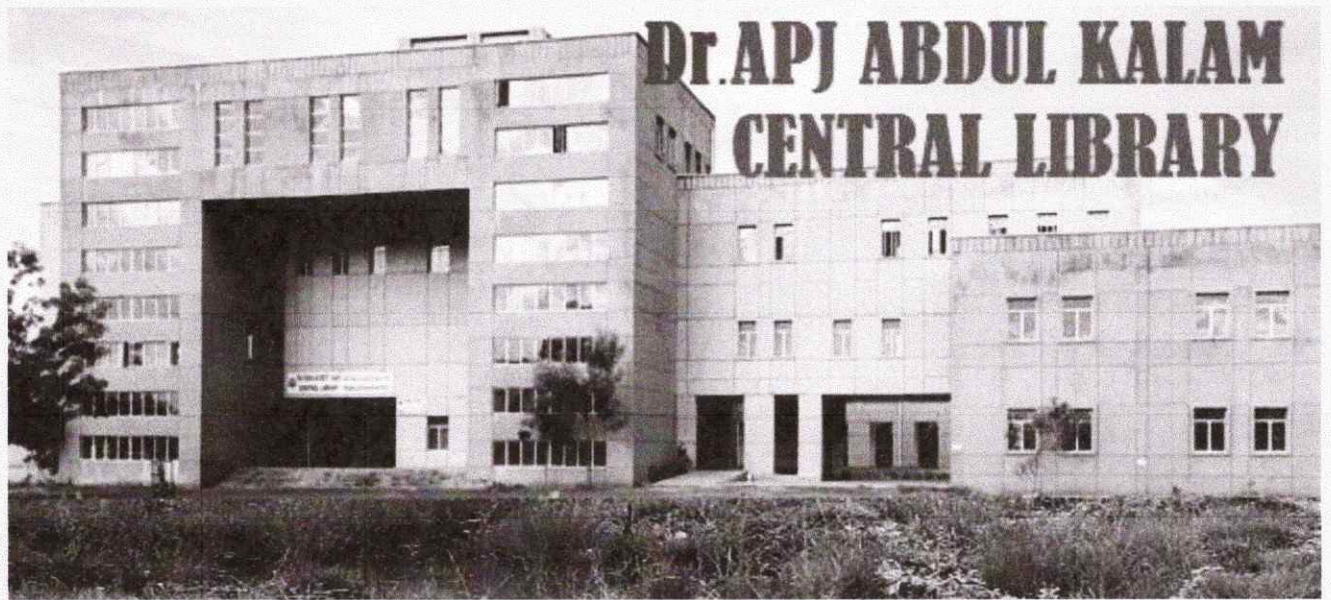

confirmed allotment letter. If any candidate(s) failed to pay the fee, the seat will be cancelled and it is treated as vacancy and will be filled in successive counselings.

10. LOCAL AND NON-LOCAL CANDIDATES

10.1 The Y.V. University area comprises of the districts Anantapur, Chittoor, Kadapa, Kurnool & Nellore.

10.2 The following candidates are treated as local to Yogi Vemana University area

10.2.1 A candidate who has studied in the Yogi Vemana University area (or stayed in case of private study) for four consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which he/she has first appeared for the final year qualifying examination.

10.2.2. A candidate who has studied (or stayed in case of private study) for seven consecutive academic years within the state of Andhra Pradesh ending with the academic year in which he/she first appeared for the final year qualifying examination and studied (or stayed in case of private study) for a maximum period in the Yogi Vemana University area.

10.2.3. In case a candidate has studied (or stayed in case of private study) for equal periods in the Y.V. University area and another University area out of the last seven years, he/she should have studied (or stayed in case of private study) lastly in the Yogi Vemana University area.

10.3 Any candidate who is not local to Yogi Vemana University is treated as non-local to Yogi Vemana University, if

10.3.1 he/she is local to any other University in Andhra Pradesh/Telangana State.

10.3.2 he/she resided for a total period of not less than 10 years in Andhra Pradesh/Telangana (excluding the periods of study outside the Andhra Pradesh/Telangana State).

10.3.3 His/her parents has resided in Andhra Pradesh/Telangana for a total period of not less than 10 years.

10.3.4 His/her parent/spouse is presently working in Andhra Pradesh/Telangana in government or allied service.

11. ALLOCATION OF SEATS TO VARIOUS RESERVATION CATEGORIES

11.1 Among the seats sanctioned in each course, 85% of the seats are given to reserved categories of local (L) candidates, while 15% are given to local and non-local candidates (L/NL) on merit. The 85% reserved seats are filled by local candidates belonging to OC (Open Category), SC (15%), ST (6%), BC-A (7%), BC-B (10%), BC-C (1%), BC-D (7%), BC-E (4%), ECA (Extracurricular activities): NCC/NSS/Sports/Cultural Activities (4%), PH (Physically handicapped) (3%) and CAP (Children of armed personnel) (2%).

At any cost total number of candidates admitted under non-local category should not exceed 15% putting together in all categories of OC, SC, ST, BC, ECA, CAP and PH. However, filling up of 15% of seats with Non-local candidates is not a must in case of non-availability of such candidates.

11.2 A vacancy under SC goes to ST and vice-versa. If enough SC&ST candidates are not available, the left-over seats reserved for them shall be treated unreserved seats and shall be filled by candidates of general pool.

11.3 29% of seats shall be reserved for the candidates belonging to the Backward Classes and shall be allocated among the following groups of Backward Classes as shown below:
BC-A (7%), BC-B (10%), BC-C (1%), BC-D (7%) and BC-E (4%)

If qualified candidates belonging to Backward Class of a particular group are not available, the leftover seats can be adjusted for the candidates of next group. If qualified candidates belonging to Backward Classes are not available to fill up the 29% seats reserved for them, the left over seats shall be treated as unreserved and shall be filled up with candidates of General Pool.

No candidates seeking reservation for admission under above categories be allowed to participate, in the Counseling for admission unless he/she produces the Integrated Community Certificated prescribed by the Govt. and issued by the Revenue Authorities in the Government (vide G.O. MS. No:58, Social Welfare (J), Dept., Dated: 12-5-1997).

11.4 For admission into Extracurricular Activities (ECA) seats, participation during the period of study of the qualifying examination is alone considered. The priorities in respect of the special categories mentioned above shall be in accordance with Government Orders issued from time to time.

11.5 Expert committees nominated by the University will certify the suitability and priority of the candidates under special categories (ECA/PH/CAP).

11.6 **Reservation for women:** One third of the seats are reserved for women candidates in each category (i.e., OC, SC, ST, BC, ECA, PH and L/NL). This rule is not applied if women candidates selected on merit in a category from one third or more of the seats therein. If there are no suitable women candidates in a category, the seats will be directed to the men candidates of the same category. Absence of adequate number of women candidates in a category cannot be compensated by giving more seats for women in another category.

12. BC-C (1%) SEATS

BC-C allotment will be done taking into consideration of the total seats available in the subject put together under college by adopting rotation system.

13. SPONSORED (SP) SEATS

In addition to the seats available in each department at Yogi Vemana University College, Kadapa, an addition of 20% sponsored seats are available and are filled on the submission of sponsored letter from Industry/Organization/others. The particulars of fee will be displayed in the DOA web site at a later date.

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ORDER:-

The Commissioner of Technical Education, Andhra Pradesh, Hyderabad is informed that the issue of implementing reservations to Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes/Backward Classes in Engineering Admissions has been examined in detail in the light of the judgement of the Supreme Court in Ritesh R. Shah Vs Dr.Y.L.Yamul AIR 1996 SC 1378 which was relied by the High Court of Andhra Pradesh in its judgement, dated 23-2-2000 in W.P.No. 26404 of 1999 & W.A.No. 795/2000 and batch and also in consultation with Backward Classes Welfare Department. The Legislature Committee on Welfare of Backward Classes, in its meeting held on 24-01-2001 has also discussed about the procedure adopted for the implementation of Backward Classes reservations for admission in Engineering Colleges and other professional courses and observed that the same procedure be adopted as followed in the admissions in the M.B.B.S. course. Besides this, there are certain representations from Backward Classes Welfare Association requesting to follow the judgement of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Ritesh Shah's case in Engineering admissions and to implement the rule of reservation for Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/Backward Classes in true spirit.

2. The Andhra Pradesh Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission into Under-graduate Professional courses through Common Entrance Test) Rules, 1993, issued in G.O.Ms.No. 184 Education dated 20-08-1993 stipulate the following reservations, namely:-

- (i) SC's 15%
- (ii) ST's 6%
- (iii) BC's 25% and shall be allocated among the four groups of Backward Classes as follows:-
 - i) Group A - 7%
 - ii) Group B - 10%
 - iii) Group C - 1%
 - iv) Group D - 7%

3. In the case of 'Ritesh R. Shah Vs. Dr. Y.L. Yamul and others' (A.I.R. 1996 S.C. 1378) the Supreme Court held as follows:-

"A student who is entitled to be admitted on the basis of merit though belonging to a reserved category cannot be considered to be admitted against seats reserved for reserved category. But at the same time the provisions should be so made that it will not work out to the disadvantage of such candidate and he may not be placed at a more disadvantageous position than the other less meritorious reserved category candidates. The aforesaid objective can be achieved if after finding out the candidates from amongst the reserved category who would otherwise come in the open merit list and then asking their option for admission into the different colleges which have been kept reserved for reserved category and there after the cases of less meritorious reserved category candidates should be considered and they will be allotted seats in whichever colleges the seats should be available." In other words, while a reserved category candidate entitled to admission on the basis of his merit will have the option of taking admission in the colleges where a specified number of seats have been kept reserved for reserved category but while computing the percentage of reservation he will be deemed to have been admitted as an open category candidate and not as a reserved category candidate.

4. Keeping in view of the judgement of the Supreme Court, the High Court in its order dated 23.2.2000 in batch of W.P. Nos. including

Contd. 3.

W.P.No. 26404 of 1999 and W.A.No. 795 of 1999 relating to MBBS admissions made by the NTR University of Health Sciences has ordered to fix the meritorious SC, ST & BC category students strictly in order of merit for the general seats adhering to the principles laid down by the Supreme Court in the Ritesh R.Shah's Case and accommodate meritorious students belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe and Backward Classes students by deleting the other students allotted in the open competition from the list and resultant equal number of vacancies shall be filled up by drawing the other meritorious candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe and Backward Classes communities who will be next eligible. Therefore, it is clear that the resultant vacancies shall be filled by the students belonging to the respective reservation categories only.

5 After careful consideration and due examination of the issue relating to implementation of reservation for Schedule Caste/Schedule Tribe and Backward Classes in Engineering and other Professional Courses the following instructions are hereby issued.

- (i) In the counselling process, the seats to be filled by open competition should be filled up first, wherein the candidates should be called for counselling based on merit alone irrespective of whether they belong to S.C., ST or B.C. in accordance with the instructions issued by the Government in G.O.Ms.No. 996, Employment & Social Welfare, dated:11th November, 1975.
- (ii) Next, reservation categories like SC/ST/BC candidates will be counselled to fill up the seats earmarked for them in their respective categories. During this process, if a candidate belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/Backward Classes who had taken admission under open competition, opts for a better branch or a better college of his choice for which he or she would be eligible as per the rules of reservation, the seat vacated by him or her in open competition shall be filled with a candidate from the same reservation category only, in order of merit.

6. Necessary amendments to the Andhra Pradesh Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions into Under-Graduate Professional Courses through Common Entrance Test) Rules, 1993 issued in G.O.Ms.No.184, Education dt.20-8-1993 shall be issued separately

7. The Commissioner of Technical Education, Andhra Pradesh/ the Chairman, A.P. State Council for Higher Education shall take further action to follow the above instructions in implementing the rule of reservation to SC/ST/BCs in admissions of Engineering, B.Arch., B.Pharmacy and other professional courses through Common Entrance tests. The Commissioner of Technical Education shall send necessary proposals for amendment of the said rules at the earliest.

In exercise of the powers conferred by sub section (1) of section 7 of the Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Castes (Rationalisation of Reservations) Ordinance, 1999 (A.P.Ordinance 6 of 1999) the Governor of Andhra Pradesh hereby makes the following Rules namely :-

Rules :-

Short title and
commencement :

1. (1) These rules may be called the Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Castes (Rationalisation of Reservations) Rules, 1999.
(2) It shall come into force from the date of publication in the Andhra Pradesh Gazette.

Definitions

2. In these rules unless the context otherwise requires,
 - (a) "Ordinance" means the Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Castes (Rationalisation of Reservations) Ordinance, 1999
 - (b) "educational institution" shall have the meaning assigned to it in clause (c) of section 2 of the Andhra Pradesh Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Prohibition of Capitation Fee) Act, 1983 (AP Act 5 of 1983)
 - (c) 'Government' means the State Government of Andhra Pradesh
 - (d) 'Public Service' means , services in any office or establishment of,
 - (i) the Government
 - (ii) a local authority i.e.,
 - a) a Gram Panchayat or a Mandal Parishad or a Zilla Parishad established under the Andhra Pradesh Panchayat Raj Act,

1994.

- b) a Municipality constituted under the Andhra Pradesh Municipalities Act, 1965 and
 - c) a Municipal Corporation established under the relevant law, for the time being in force, relating to Municipal Corporations;
 - iii) a Corporation or undertaking wholly owned or controlled by Government.
 - iv) a body established under any law made by the Legislature of the State whether incorporated or not including a University and
 - v) any other body established by the Government or by a Society registered under any law relating to the registration of societies for the time being in force and receiving funds from the State Government either fully or partly, for its maintenance or any educational institution, whether registered or not, but receiving aid from the Government;
- e) 'Rule of Reservation' means any rule or provision for reservation of appointments or posts in public service in the special rules applicable to any particular service or the General Rules of the Andhra Pradesh State and Subordinate Service Rules, as the case may be or any rule or provision for reservation of seats in the rules or instructions for admission into educational institutions, as the case may be, in favour of Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes or Backward Classes or Women.
- f) 'Scheduled Castes shall have the meaning assigned to it in clause (24) of article 366 of the Constitution of India.

Procedure for implementation of the rule of reservation

3. In order to implement the rule of reservation under section 3 of the Ordinance

- (1) One percent of the seats both in public appointments or posts and admissions to educational institutions shall be reserved for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes referred to in Clause (a) of Section 3 of the Ordinance.

Provided that in the case of reservation of appointments or posts it shall be allotted to Sl.No.2 of the roster as specified in rule (22) (e) of the Andhra Pradesh State and Subordinate Service Rules 1996.

- (2) seven percent of the seats both in public appointments or posts and admissions to educational institutions shall be reserved for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes referred to in clause (b) of Section 3 of the Ordinance;

Provided that in the case of reservation of appointments or posts it shall be allotted to Sl.No.7,22,41,62,72,87 and 97 of the roster as specified in rule 22(e) of the Andhra Pradesh State

and Subordinate Service Rules 1996.

(3) six percent of the seats both in public appointments or posts and admissions to educational institutions shall be reserved for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes referred to in clause (c) of Section 3 of the Ordinance;

Provided that in the case of reservation of appointments or posts it shall be allotted to Sl.No.16,27,47,66,77 and 91 of the roster as specified in rule 22 (e) of the Andhra Pradesh State and Subordinate Service Rules, 1996;

(4) one percent of the seats both in public appointments of posts and admissions to educational institutions shall be reserved for the persons belonging to the scheduled castes referred to in clause (d) of section 3 of the Ordinance;

Provided that in the case of reservation of appointments or posts it shall be allotted to Sl.No.52 of the roster as specified in rule 22(e) of the Andhra Pradesh State and subordinate Service Rules, 1996.

Reservation for women

4. The reservation for women to an extent of 33 1/3% provided in public services in each roster cycle of 100 points fixed shall be adjusted by allotting two seats for Scheduled Castes-B and two seats to Scheduled Castes-C and one seat alternately for Scheduled Castes-A and one seat to Scheduled Castes-D as specified in Section 3 of the Ordinance.

Non-availability of eligible candidates

5. (1) if eligible candidates for public appointments or posts are not available to fill the slots reserved for them in the roster points as specified in rule 3 it shall be filled in by the candidates belonging to the next group of the Scheduled Castes communities as specified in Section 3 of the Ordinance.

Note :- If an eligible candidate of Scheduled Castes-A is not available, the roster point may be filled by a candidate Scheduled Castes-B and so on and so forth. In the case of women candidates also in the roster point fixed for Scheduled Castes-A (woman), if an eligible woman candidate is not available, the roster point may be filled by a women candidate belonging to the Scheduled Castes-B group and so on and so forth.

(2) If eligible candidate for admission to educational institutions are not available to fill up the seats as specified in rule 3 it shall be filled in by the candidate belonging to the next group of Scheduled Caste communities.

Carry forward of vacancies

6. If no eligible Scheduled Caste Candidate (including woman candidate) belonging to any of the Scheduled

Castes referred to in clauses (a), (b), (c) and (d) of Section 3 of the Ordinance is available then the vacancy shall be carried forward and shall not be filled by a candidate belonging to any other community other than the Scheduled Castes in accordance with the rules or the instructions issued by the Government in this regard.

Applicability of the rules in educational institutions

7. These Rules shall be made applicable in all the educational institutions under the control of the State Government, wherever rule of reservation is applicable

Non-applicability of the rules in public appointments/admissions

8. (1) in the case of public appointments for the filling up of backlog vacancies or regular vacancies to be filled by Scheduled Caste Candidates, Pursuant to various Government instructions issued in this regard from time to time, and where the selection process has been completed and appointment orders have been dispatched or the applicant has been intimated officially that he or she has been intimated officially that has selected and should await posting orders, these rules shall not be made applicable.

2. Similarly, in the case of admissions into educational institutions wherever the admissions have been finalised and the applicant has been intimated officially that he or she has been selected for admission, these rules shall not be made applicable.

Applicability of the rules in case of various stages of the selection/admission process

9. (1) Wherever the selection process for filling up the backlog vacancies or regular vacancies are at various stages, such as (a) the vacancies have been notified (b) the applications have been received (c) the call letters have been sent to applicants to appear for written test or or interview or both; (d) the written tests or interview or both have been completed but the appointment orders have not been dispatched or selection has not been intimated to applicants, in such cases the appointing authorities shall follow the procedure as specified in rule 3 and 4 of these rules.

(2) Similarly, in the case of admission into educational institutions wherever the selection process for admission is at various stages such as (a) vacancies have been notified (b) applications have been received (c) the applicants have been asked to appear for any written test and interview or counseling (d) the written test and interview or counseling have been completed but the admissions have not been intimated to the applicants, in such cases the admissions shall be completed following the rule of reservation as specified in rule 3 and 4 of these rules.

Applicability of the rules in future appointments/admissions to educational institutions

These rules shall be made applicable to all public appointments and admissions to educational institutions from the date of commencement of these rules wherever rule of reservation is applicable.

ORDER:

The Government of India, in the reference 1st read above, has brought out the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019 inserting Clauses 15 (6) and 16 (6) in the Constitution providing for 10% reservation in admissions into Educational Institutions and appointments to posts in favour of Economically Weaker Sections of citizens other than the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes.

2 In pursuance of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019, the Government of India have, in the reference 2nd read above, prescribed the eligibility criteria to get the benefit of 10% reservation in admissions into Educational Institutions and appointments to posts provided in favour of Economically Weaker Sections of citizens other than the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes among others which are as follows:

- 1) The persons who are not covered under existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes and whose gross annual family income is below Rs.8.00 lakh are to be identified as EWS for the benefit of reservation.
- 2) The persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS for the benefit of reservation, irrespective of the family income.

- i. Five (5) Acres of agricultural land and above.
- ii. Residential flat of 1000 Sq. ft. and above.
- iii. Residential plot of 100 Sq. Yards and above in notified Municipalities / Corporations.
- iv. Residential plot of 200 Sq. Yards and above in areas other than notified Municipalities / Corporations.

The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.

The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who seeks benefit of reservation, his/her parents and siblings below the age of 18 years as also his/her spouse and children below the age of 18 years.

3 After passing of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019, the Government of Andhra Pradesh have bifurcated the 10% reservation and brought out two Acts, namely, Act No.14 of 2019, Dated:20.02.2019 and Act No.15 of 2019, Dated:20.02.2019, providing for 5% reservation to Economically Weaker Sections among Kapus and 5% reservation to Economically Weaker Sections among other than Kapus respectively, towards admissions into Educational Institutions and appointments to posts in the Public Services under the State. There shall be 1/3rd horizontal reservation for women within in the reservation provided both to Kapus and other than Kapus.

4 In the reference 4th read above, the Government have issued orders bringing the provisions of the Act 14 of 2019 and Act 15 of 2019 into force with effect from 08.03.2019.

5 In the reference 5th read above, Government have constituted a Committee for formulation of draft guidelines for implementation of 5% reservation provided to Economically Weaker Sections among Kapus and 5% reservation provided to Economically Weaker Sections other than Kapus.

6 Meanwhile, a Writ Petition bearing No. WP (CIVIL) No. 343 OF 2019 with I.A.NO. 45038/2019 has been filed before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India praying for quashing the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019 as violative of basic structure of the Constitution and also quashing Act 14 & Act 15 of 2019 enacted by Government of Andhra Pradesh as being violative of Articles 15 (1) & 16 (2) of the Constitution.

7 In the reference 7th & 8th read above, two Writ Petitions have been filed before the Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh praying for issuing an appropriate Writ or Order or direction more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus to the respondents to notify the Rules for implementing the 10% reservation provided to Economically Weaker Sections among Kapus and other than Kapus in Act No.14 of 2019 and Act No.15 of 2019 enacted by the State of Andhra Pradesh.

8 In the reference 9th read above, one more Writ Petition has been filed before the Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh praying for issuing an appropriate Writ or Order or direction more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus declaring Act No.14 of 2019 and Act No.15 of 2019 as ultra vires and un-constitutional, violative of the purport of the 103rd Constitutional Amendment Act, 2019 and violative of Article 15 of the Constitution of India and consequently, Act No.14 of 2019 and Act No.15 of 2019, have to be struck down. The Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh passed the following Interim orders in this case:

"Notice before admission.

Petitioners filed the Writ Petition seeking Mandamus declaring Act 14 and Act 15 of 2019, as ultra vires, unconstitutional, violative of the purport of the 103rd Constitutional Amendment, violative of

Article 15 of the Constitution of India and consequently to strike down Act 14 and Act 15 of 2019.

Petitioners also sought interim relief, to direct the Respondents 6 and 7 to follow 103rd Constitutional Amendment Act during admissions into Medical and Engineering Courses and allot seats in the supernumerary seats created by the 4th Respondent, only in accordance with the policy of the 4th Respondent, with regard to Economically Weaker Sections, pending disposal of the writ petition.

It is the case of the petitioners that Act 14 and Act 15 of 2019, creating reservation in Educational Institutions to Kapu community based on their economic backwardness, is contrary to the 103rd Amendment.

In fact, it is brought to the notice of the Court that a petition challenging 103rd Constitutional Amendment is pending before the Honourable Supreme Court, but the main contention is that Act 14 and Act 15 are inconsistent with the purport of 103rd Constitutional Amendment. At this stage, it is not possible to decide the core issue i.e. the vires of Act 14 and 15 of 2019, making another class within the original class, without inviting counter-affidavit from the respondents.

Therefore, there shall be a direction to the respondents to complete the admission process, pending further orders, subject to the result of the Writ Petition, by obtaining an undertaking from the petitioners to the effect that in case the petitioners do not succeed in the writ petition, they shall not claim any equities in future based on the admissions.

Post after three weeks, by which time respondents shall file their counter-affidavits".

9. In view of the above Government hereby decided to fill up the EWS quota of supernumerary seats in Higher Educational Institutions in accordance with 103rd Constitutional Amendment Act, 2019 and the guidelines issued by Govt., of India vide Office Memorandum F.No.36039/1/2019-Estt(Res.) Dated: 19.01.2019. The guidelines relevant for current academic year 2019-2020, in regard to the subject matter consistent with 103rd Constitutional Amendment, would read as under:

- i. All Castes which are not covered under any reservation category (SC / ST / BC) are entitled to avail of the reservation facility under EWS Category.
- ii. The students admitted under EWS Category will be adjusted against the 10 percent of the sanctioned seats granted additionally, as is followed by the Government of India. However, 1/3rd (33 1/3) of the seats enhanced for the purpose of accommodating the EWS Category students shall be earmarked to women among them.
- iii. The model format of the EWS Certificate prescribed by Government of India in Annexure-1 vide their O.M.No.36039/1/2019-Estt. (Res), Dated: 31-1-2019 shall be followed along with the conditions referred in para 2 above.
- iv. The persons seeking the benefit of reservation under EWS category shall obtain the necessary EWS Certificate issued by the Tahsildar concerned.
- v. The eligibility conditions for a person to avail of the facility of EWS reservation are the same as fixed by the Government of India as referred in Para 2 above:

10. Further, in regard to implementation of reservations to EWS Category in appointments to the posts or services under State, necessary orders will be issued separately.

11. All the Administrative Departments concerned / Districts Collectors are therefore requested to take necessary action accordingly.

9.4 If a candidate fails to attend the counseling at the specified date and time for whatever reason he/she will forfeit the seat and the candidate next in rank will be considered for admission. Any representation for postponement of the date and time of personal appearance will not be entertained.

9.5 At the time of counseling, the following original documents should be submitted by the candidate:

- a) YVUCET-2017 Rank card and Hall Ticket.
- b) Marks statements and Provisional/Degree Certificate of the qualifying examination
- c) Transfer and Conduct certificates (**Admission will not be given if T.C. of the institution where the candidate studied last is not submitted**)
- d) SSC and Intermediate pass certificates
- e) Two Passport size photographs
- f) Study certificates from IX class to qualifying examination
- g) Caste certificate in original from the Tahshildar in case of SC/ST/BC candidates, obtained in the year 2017 OR permanent caste certificate
- h) Income certificate from the Tahshildar obtained in 2017 (for those who wish to apply for Scholarship/ fee concession). Fee concession will not be given if income certificate is not submitted.
- i) Relevant certificate in case of physically challenged/extra curricular activities (NCC/NSS/Games & Sports / Cultural Activity) category.
- j) Discharge certificate and service certificate of the parent in case of a child of armed person.
- k) Residence Certificate of parents for stay in the state of A.P. from Tahshildar in case of candidates, who have studied outside A.P./ carried out private study.
- l) Migration certificate (for other University candidates)

9.6 The cases of pending revaluation will not be considered.

9.7 After the announcement of the results, qualified candidates will be called for the admission counseling for the certificate verification to assess the eligibility and other credentials. Provisional seat allotment to the candidates will be given based on the availability of seats and by following the rule of reservation. After the provisional seat allotment candidates need to pay the required fee before the stipulated time to get the confirmed allotment letter. If any candidate(s) failed to pay the fee, the seat will be cancelled and it is treated as vacancy and will be filled in successive counselings.

10. LOCAL AND NON-LOCAL CANDIDATES

10.1 The Y.V.University area comprises of the districts Anantapur, Chittoor, Kadapa, Kurnool & Nellore.

10.2 The following candidates are treated as local to Yogi Vemana University area

10.2.1 A candidate who has studied in the Yogi Vemana University area (or stayed in case of private study) for four consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which he/she has first appeared for the final year qualifying examination.

10.2.2. A candidate who has studied (or stayed in case of private study) for seven consecutive academic years within the state of Andhra Pradesh ending with the academic year in which he/she first appeared for the final year qualifying examination and studied (or stayed in case of private study) for a maximum period in the Yogi Vemana University area.

10.2.3. In case a candidate has studied (or stayed in case of private study) for equal periods in the Y.V.University area and another University area out of the last seven years, he/she should have studied (or stayed in case of private study) lastly in the Yogi Vemana University area.

10.3 Any candidate who is not local to Yogi Vemana University is treated as non-local to Yogi Vemana University, if

10.3.1 he/she is local to any other University in Andhra Pradesh/Telangana State.

10.3.2 he/she resided for a total period of not less than 10 years in Andhra Pradesh/Telangana (excluding the periods of study outside the Andhra Pradesh/Telangana State).

10.3.3 His/her parents has resided in Andhra Pradesh/Telangana for a total period of not less than 10 years.

10.3.4 His/her parent/spouse is presently working in Andhra Pradesh/Telangana in government or allied service.

11. ALLOCATION OF SEATS TO VARIOUS RESERVATION CATEGORIES

11.1 Among the seats sanctioned in each course, 85% of the seats are given to reserved categories of local (L) candidates, while 15% are given to local and non-local candidates (L/NL) on merit. The 85% reserved seats are filled by local candidates belonging to OC (Open Category), SC (15%), ST(6%), BC-A(7%), BC-B(10%), BC-C(1%), BC-D(7%), BC-E (4%), ECA (Extracurricular activities): NCC/NSS/Sports/Cultural Activities (4%), PH (Physically handicapped) (3%) and CAP (Children of armed personnel) (2%).

At any cost total number of candidates admitted under non-local category should not exceed 15% putting together in all categories of OC, SC, ST, BC, ECA, CAP and PH. However, filling up of 15% of seats with Non-local candidates is not a must in case of non-availability of such candidates.

11.2 A vacancy under SC goes to ST and vice-versa. If enough SC&ST candidates are not available, the left-over seats reserved for them shall be treated unreserved seats and shall be filled by candidates of general pool.

11.3 25% of seats shall be reserved for the candidates belonging to the Backward Classes and shall be allocated among the following groups of Backward Classes as shown below:

GROUP 'A'(7%), GROUP 'B' (10%), GROUP 'C'(1%), GROUP 'D' (7%) and GROUP 'E'(4%)

If qualified candidates belonging to Backward Class of a particular group are not available, the leftover seats can be adjusted for the candidates of next group. If qualified candidates belonging to Backward Classes are not available to fill up the 25% seats reserved for them, the left over seats shall be treated as unreserved and shall be filled up with candidates of General Pool.

No candidates seeking reservation for admission under above categories be allowed to participate, in the Counseling for admission unless he/she produces the Integrated Community Certificated prescribed by the Govt. and issued by the Revenue Authorities in the Government (vide G.O. MS. No:58, Social Welfare (J), Dept., Dated: 12-5-1997).

- 11.4 For admission into Extracurricular Activities (ECA) seats, participation during the period of study of the qualifying examination is alone considered. The priorities in respect of the special categories mentioned above shall be in accordance with Government Orders issued from time to time.
- 11.5 Expert committees nominated by the University will certify the suitability and priority of the candidates under special categories (ECA/PH/CAP).
- 11.6 **Reservation for women:** One third of the seats are reserved for women candidates in each category (i.e., OC, SC, ST, BC, ECA, PH and L/NL). This rule is not applied if women candidates selected on merit in a category form one third or more of the seats therein. If there are no suitable women candidates in a category, the seats will be directed to the men candidates of the same category. Absence of adequate number of women candidates in a category cannot be compensated by giving more seats for women in another category.

12. BC-C (1%) SEATS

BC-C allotment will be done taking into consideration of the total seats available in the subject put together under college by adopting rotation system.

13. SPONSORED (SP) SEATS

YV University College (To be paid at the time of admission. No need to pay in second year) M. Sc. Organic Chemistry – Rs.70,000. Admission under sponsored seats will be done simultaneously along with regular and SF seats. Candidates are advised to come prepared with necessary fee.

14. FEE PARTICULARS

The details of fee to be paid at the time of admission for various PG courses are given in the following table. OC-fee means fee for general category without admissible income for fee reimbursement. Admission fee for income certificate holders means fee for candidates who are eligible for fee reimbursement under SC/ST category whose parents' annual income is less than Rs.2,00,000/- and for BC/OC candidates whose parents' annual income is less than Rs.1,00,000/-

If any admitted candidate(s) who cannot get fee reimbursement from the Government he/she has to pay the specified fee to the University immediately, as agreed earlier. In case if government will not reimburse the equivalent fee as specified above, the candidate has to pay the balance fee to the University, as agreed earlier.

Candidates those who called for counseling has to pay an amount of Rs.400/- (Rs.200/- for SC/ST) towards counseling fee.

Other University students have to pay an additional fee of Rs. 250/-.

Income certificate of parent must be taken from Tahsildar in the year 2017.

Computer lab fee of Rs.1,000/- extra for, Economics, and M. Com. courses.

Study tour/media visit fee of Rs. 100/- extra for M. A. Communication and Journalism course.

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ORDER:-

The Commissioner of Technical Education, Andhra Pradesh, Hyderabad is informed that the issue of implementing reservations to Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes/Backward Classes in Engineering Admissions has been examined in detail in the light of the judgement of the Supreme Court in Ritesh R. Shah Vs Dr.Y.L.Yamul AIR 1996 SC 1378 which was relied by the High Court of Andhra Pradesh in its judgement, dated 23-2-2000 in W.P.No. 26404 of 1999 & W.A.No. 795/2000 and batch and also in consultation with Backward Classes Welfare Department. The Legislature Committee on Welfare of Backward Classes, in its meeting held on 24-01-2001 has also discussed about the procedure adopted for the implementation of Backward Classes reservations for admission in Engineering Colleges and other professional courses and observed that the same procedure be adopted as followed in the admissions in the M.B.B.S. course. Besides this, there are certain representations from Backward Classes Welfare Association requesting to follow the judgement of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Ritesh Shah's case in Engineering admissions and to implement the rule of reservation for Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/Backward Classes in true spirit.

2. The Andhra Pradesh Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission into Under-graduate Professional courses through Common Entrance Test) Rules, 1993, issued in G.O.Ms.No. 184 Education dated 20-08-1993 stipulate the following reservations, namely:-

- (i) SC's 15%
- (ii) ST's 6%
- (iii) BC's 25% and shall be allocated among the four groups of Backward Classes as follows:-
 - i) Group A - 7%
 - ii) Group B - 10%
 - iii) Group C - 1%
 - iv) Group D - 7%

3. In the case of 'Ritesh R. Shah Vs. Dr. Y.L. Yamul and others' (A.I.R. 1996 S.C. 1378) the Supreme Court held as follows:-

"A student who is entitled to be admitted on the basis of merit though belonging to a reserved category cannot be considered to be admitted against seats reserved for reserved category. But at the same time the provisions should be so made that it will not work out to the disadvantage of such candidate and he may not be placed at a more disadvantageous position than the other less meritorious reserved category candidates. The aforesaid objective can be achieved if after finding out the candidates from amongst the reserved category who would otherwise come in the open merit list and then asking their option for admission into the different colleges which have been kept reserved for reserved category and there after the cases of less meritorious reserved category candidates should be considered and they will be allotted seats in whichever colleges the seats should be available." In other words, while a reserved category candidate entitled to admission on the basis of his merit will have the option of taking admission in the colleges where a specified number of seats have been kept reserved for reserved category but while computing the percentage of reservation he will be deemed to have been admitted as an open category candidate and not as a reserved category candidate.

4. Keeping in view of the judgement of the Supreme Court, the High Court in its order dated 23.2.2000 in batch of W.P. Nos. including

Contd. 3.

W.P.No. 26404 of 1999 and W.A.No. 795 of 1999 relating to MBBS admissions made by the NTR University of Health Sciences has ordered to fix the meritorious SC, ST & BC category students strictly in order of merit for the general seats adhering to the principles laid down by the Supreme Court in the Ritesh R.Shah's Case and accommodate meritorious students belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe and Backward Classes students by deleting the other students allotted in the open competition from the list and resultant equal number of vacancies shall be filled up by drawing the other meritorious candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe and Backward Classes communities who will be next eligible. Therefore, it is clear that the resultant vacancies shall be filled by the students belonging to the respective reservation categories only.

5 After careful consideration and due examination of the issue relating to implementation of reservation for Schedule Caste/Schedule Tribe and Backward Classes in Engineering and other Professional Courses the following instructions are hereby issued.

- (i) In the counselling process, the seats to be filled by open competition should be filled up first, wherein the candidates should be called for counselling based on merit alone irrespective of whether they belong to S.C., ST or B.C. in accordance with the instructions issued by the Government in G.O.Ms.No. 996, Employment & Social Welfare, dated: 11th November, 1975.
- (ii) Next, reservation categories like SC/ST/BC candidates will be counselled to fill up the seats earmarked for them in their respective categories. During this process, if a candidate belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/Backward Classes who had taken admission under open competition, opts for a better branch or a better college of his choice for which he or she would be eligible as per the rules of reservation, the seat vacated by him or her in open competition shall be filled with a candidate from the same reservation category only, in order of merit.

6. Necessary amendments to the Andhra Pradesh Professional Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions into Under-Graduate Professional Courses through Common Entrance Test) Rules, 1993 issued in G.O.Ms.No.184, Education dt.20-8-1993 shall be issued separately

7. The Commissioner of Technical Education, Andhra Pradesh/ the Chairman, A.P. State Council for Higher Education, shall take further action to follow the above instructions, in implementing the rule of reservation to SC/ST/BCs in admissions of Engineering, B.Arch., B.Pharmacy and other professional courses through Common Entrance tests. The Commissioner of Technical Education shall send necessary proposals for amendment of the said rules at the earliest.

In exercise of the powers conferred by sub section (1) of section 7 of the Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Castes (Rationalisation of Reservations) Ordinance, 1999 (A.P.Ordinance 6 of 1999) the Governor of Andhra Pradesh hereby makes the following Rules namely :-

Rules :-

Short title and
commencement :

1. (1) These rules may be called the Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Castes (Rationalisation of Reservations) Rules, 1999.
(2) It shall come into force from the date of publication in the Andhra Pradesh Gazette.

Definitions

2. In these rules unless the context otherwise requires,
 - (a) "Ordinance" means the Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Castes (Rationalisation of Reservations) Ordinance, 1999
 - (b) "educational institution" shall have the meaning assigned to it in clause (c) of section 2 of the Andhra Pradesh Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admission and Prohibition of Capitation Fee) Act, 1983 (AP Act 5 of 1983)
 - (c) 'Government' means the State Government of Andhra Pradesh
 - (d) 'Public Service' means , services in any office or establishment of,
 - (i) the Government
 - (ii) a local authority i.e.,
 - a) a Gram Panchayat or a Mandal Parishad or a Zilla Parishad established under the Andhra Pradesh Panchayat Raj Act,

1994.

- b) a Municipality constituted under the Andhra Pradesh Municipalities Act, 1965 and
 - c) a Municipal Corporation established under the relevant law, for the time being in force, relating to Municipal Corporations;
 - iii) a Corporation or undertaking wholly owned or controlled by Government.
 - iv) a body established under any law made by the Legislature of the State whether incorporated or not including a University and
 - v) any other body established by the Government or by a Society registered under any law relating to the registration of societies for the time being in force and receiving funds from the State Government either fully or partly, for its maintenance or any educational institution, whether registered or not, but receiving aid from the Government;
- e) 'Rule of Reservation' means any rule or provision for reservation of appointments or posts in public service in the special rules applicable to any particular service or the General Rules of the Andhra Pradesh State and Subordinate Service Rules, as the case may be or any rule or provision for reservation of seats in the rules or instructions for admission into educational institutions, as the case may be, in favour of Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes or Backward Classes or Women.
- f) 'Scheduled Castes shall have the meaning assigned to it in clause (24) of article 366 of the Constitution of India.

Procedure for implementation of the rule of reservation

3. In order to implement the rule of reservation under section 3 of the Ordinance

- (1) One percent of the seats both in public appointments or posts and admissions to educational institutions shall be reserved for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes referred to in Clause (a) of Section 3 of the Ordinance.

Provided that in the case of reservation of appointments or posts it shall be allotted to Sl.No.2 of the roster as specified in rule (22) (e) of the Andhra Pradesh State and Subordinate Service Rules 1996.

- (2) seven percent of the seats both in public appointments or posts and admissions to educational institutions shall be reserved for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes referred to in clause (b) of Section 3 of the Ordinance;

Provided that in the case of reservation of appointments or posts it shall be allotted to Sl.No.7,22,41,62,72,87 and 97 of the roster as specified in rule 22(e) of the Andhra Pradesh State

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and Subordinate Service Rules 1996.

(3) six percent of the seats both in public appointments or posts and admissions to educational institutions shall be reserved for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes referred to in clause (c) of Section 3 of the Ordinance;

Provided that in the case of reservation of appointments or posts it shall be allotted to Sl.No.16,27,47,66,77 and 91 of the roster as specified in rule 22 (e) of the Andhra Pradesh State and Subordinate Service Rules, 1996;

(4) one percent of the seats both in public appointments of posts and admissions to educational institutions shall be reserved for the persons belonging to the scheduled castes referred to in clause (d) of section 3 of the Ordinance;

Provided that in the case of reservation of appointments or posts it shall be allotted to Sl.No.52 of the roster as specified in rule 22(e) of the Andhra Pradesh State and subordinate Service Rules, 1996.

Reservation for women

4. The reservation for women to an extent of 33 1/3% provided in public services in each roster cycle of 100 points fixed shall be adjusted by allotting two seats for Scheduled Castes-B and two seats to Scheduled Castes-C and one seat alternately for Scheduled Castes-A and one seat to Scheduled Castes-D as specified in Section 3 of the Ordinance.

Non-availability of eligible candidates

5. (1) if eligible candidates for public appointments or posts are not available to fill the slots reserved for them in the roster points as specified in rule 3 it shall be filled in by the candidates belonging to the next group of the Scheduled Castes communities as specified in Section 3 of the Ordinance.

Note :- If an eligible candidate of Scheduled Castes-A is not available, the roster point may be filled by a candidate Scheduled Castes-B and so on and so forth. In the case of women candidates also in the roster point fixed for Scheduled Castes-A (woman), if an eligible woman candidate is not available, the roster point may be filled by a women candidate belonging to the Scheduled Castes-B group and so on and so forth.

(2) If eligible candidate for admission to educational institutions are not available to fill up the seats as specified in rule 3 it shall be filled in by the candidate belonging to the next group of Scheduled Caste communities.

Carry forward of vacancies

6. If no eligible Scheduled Caste Candidate (including woman candidate) belonging to any of the Scheduled

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Castes referred to in clauses (a), (b), (c) and (d) of Section 3 of the Ordinance is available then the vacancy shall be carried forward and shall not be filled by a candidate belonging to any other community other than the Scheduled Castes in accordance with the rules or the instructions issued by the Government in this regard.

Applicability of the rules in educational institutions

7. These Rules shall be made applicable in all the educational institutions under the control of the State Government, wherever rule of reservation is applicable

Non-applicability of the rules in public appointments/admissions

8. (1) in the case of public appointments for the filling up of backlog vacancies or regular vacancies to be filled by Scheduled Caste Candidates, Pursuant to various Government instructions issued in this regard from time to time, and where the selection process has been completed and appointment orders have been dispatched or the applicant has been intimated officially that he or she has been intimated officially that has selected and should await posting orders, these rules shall not be made applicable.

2. Similarly, in the case of admissions into educational institutions wherever the admissions have been finalised and the applicant has been intimated officially that he or she has been selected for admission, these rules shall not be made applicable.

Applicability of the rules in case of various stages of the selection/admission process

9. (1) Wherever the selection process for filling up the backlog vacancies or regular vacancies are at various stages, such as (a) the vacancies have been notified (b) the applications have been received (c) the call letters have been sent to applicants to appear for written test or or interview or both; (d) the written tests or interview or both have been completed but the appointment orders have not been dispatched or selection has not been intimated to applicants, in such cases the appointing authorities shall follow the procedure as specified in rule 3 and 4 of these rules.

(2) Similarly, in the case of admission into educational institutions wherever the selection process for admission is at various stages such as (a) vacancies have been notified (b) applications have been received (c) the applicants have been asked to appear for any written test and interview or counseling (d) the written test and interview or counseling have been completed but the admissions have not been intimated to the applicants, in such cases the admissions shall be completed following the rule of reservation as specified in rule 3 and 4 of these rules.

Applicability of the rules in future appointments/admissions to educational institutions

These rules shall be made applicable to all public appointments and admissions to educational institutions from the date of commencement of these rules wherever rule of reservation is applicable.

ORDER:

The Government of India, in the reference 1st read above, has brought out the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019 inserting Clauses 15 (6) and 16 (6) in the Constitution providing for 10% reservation in admissions into Educational Institutions and appointments to posts in favour of Economically Weaker Sections of citizens other than the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes.

2. In pursuance of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019, the Government of India have, in the reference 2nd read above, prescribed the eligibility criteria to get the benefit of 10% reservation in admissions into Educational Institutions and appointments to posts provided in favour of Economically Weaker Sections of citizens other than the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes among others which are as follows:

- 1) The persons who are not covered under existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes and whose gross annual family income is below Rs.8.00 lakh are to be identified as EWS for the benefit of reservation.
- 2) The persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS for the benefit of reservation, irrespective of the family income.

- i. Five (5) Acres of agricultural land and above.
- ii. Residential flat of 1000 Sq. ft. and above.
- iii. Residential plot of 100 Sq. Yards and above in notified Municipalities / Corporations.
- iv. Residential plot of 200 Sq. Yards and above in areas other than notified Municipalities / Corporations.

The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.

The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who seeks benefit of reservation, his/her parents and siblings below the age of 18 years as also his/her spouse and children below the age of 18 years.

3 After passing of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019, the Government of Andhra Pradesh have bifurcated the 10% reservation and brought out two Acts, namely, Act No.14 of 2019, Dated:20.02.2019 and Act No.15 of 2019, Dated:20.02.2019, providing for 5% reservation to Economically Weaker Sections among Kapus and 5% reservation to Economically Weaker Sections among other than Kapus respectively, towards admissions into Educational Institutions and appointments to posts in the Public Services under the State. There shall be 1/3rd horizontal reservation for women within in the reservation provided both to Kapus and other than Kapus.

4 In the reference 4th read above, the Government have issued orders bringing the provisions of the Act 14 of 2019 and Act 15 of 2019 into force with effect from 08.03.2019.

5 In the reference 5th read above, Government have constituted a Committee for formulation of draft guidelines for implementation of 5% reservation provided to Economically Weaker Sections among Kapus and 5% reservation provided to Economically Weaker Sections other than Kapus.

6 Meanwhile, a Writ Petition bearing No. WP (CIVIL) No. 343 OF 2019 with I.A.NO. 45038/2019 has been filed before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India praying for quashing the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act, 2019 as violative of basic structure of the Constitution and also quashing Act 14 & Act 15 of 2019 enacted by Government of Andhra Pradesh as being violative of Articles 15 (1) & 16 (2) of the Constitution.

7 In the reference 7th & 8th read above, two Writ Petitions have been filed before the Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh praying for issuing an appropriate Writ or Order or direction more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus to the respondents to notify the Rules for implementing the 10% reservation provided to Economically Weaker Sections among Kapus and other than Kapus in Act No.14 of 2019 and Act No.15 of 2019 enacted by the State of Andhra Pradesh.

8 In the reference 9th read above, one more Writ Petition has been filed before the Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh praying for issuing an appropriate Writ or Order or direction more particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus declaring Act No.14 of 2019 and Act No.15 of 2019 as ultra vires and un-constitutional, violative of the purport of the 103rd Constitutional Amendment Act, 2019 and violative of Article 15 of the Constitution of India and consequently, Act No.14 of 2019 and Act No.15 of 2019, have to be struck down. The Hon'ble High Court of Andhra Pradesh passed the following Interim orders in this case:

"Notice before admission.

Petitioners filed the Writ Petition seeking Mandamus declaring Act 14 and Act 15 of 2019, as ultra vires, unconstitutional, violative of the purport of the 103rd Constitutional Amendment, violative of

Article 15 of the Constitution of India and consequently to strike down Act 14 and Act 15 of 2019.

Petitioners also sought interim relief, to direct the Respondents 6 and 7 to follow 103rd Constitutional Amendment Act during admissions into Medical and Engineering Courses and allot seats in the supernumerary seats created by the 4th Respondent, only in accordance with the policy of the 4th Respondent, with regard to Economically Weaker Sections, pending disposal of the writ petition.

It is the case of the petitioners that Act 14 and Act 15 of 2019, creating reservation in Educational Institutions to Kapu community based on their economic backwardness, is contrary to the 103rd Amendment.

In fact, it is brought to the notice of the Court that a petition challenging 103rd Constitutional Amendment is pending before the Honourable Supreme Court, but the main contention is that Act 14 and Act 15 are inconsistent with the purport of 103rd Constitutional Amendment. At this stage, it is not possible to decide the core issue i.e. the vires of Act 14 and 15 of 2019, making another class within the original class, without inviting counter-affidavit from the respondents.

Therefore, there shall be a direction to the respondents to complete the admission process, pending further orders, subject to the result of the Writ Petition, by obtaining an undertaking from the petitioners to the effect that in case the petitioners do not succeed in the writ petition, they shall not claim any equities in future based on the admissions.

Post after three weeks, by which time respondents shall file their counter-affidavits".

9. In view of the above Government hereby decided to fill up the EWS quota of supernumerary seats in Higher Educational Institutions in accordance with 103rd Constitutional Amendment Act, 2019 and the guidelines issued by Govt., of India vide Office Memorandum F.No.36039/1/2019-Estt(Res.) Dated: 19.01.2019. The guidelines relevant for current academic year 2019-2020, in regard to the subject matter consistent with 103rd Constitutional Amendment, would read as under:

- i. All Castes which are not covered under any reservation category (SC / ST / BC) are entitled to avail of the reservation facility under EWS Category.
- ii. The students admitted under EWS Category will be adjusted against the 10 percent of the sanctioned seats granted additionally, as is followed by the Government of India. However, 1/3rd (33 1/3) of the seats enhanced for the purpose of accommodating the EWS Category students shall be earmarked to women among them.
- iii. The model format of the EWS Certificate prescribed by Government of India in Annexure-1 vide their O.M.No.36039/1/2019-Estt. (Res), Dated: 31-1-2019 shall be followed along with the conditions referred in para 2 above.
- iv. The persons seeking the benefit of reservation under EWS category shall obtain the necessary EWS Certificate issued by the Tahsildar concerned.
- v. The eligibility conditions for a person to avail of the facility of EWS reservation are the same as fixed by the Government of India as referred in Para 2 above:

10. Further, in regard to implementation of reservations to EWS Category in appointments to the posts or services under State, necessary orders will be issued separately.

11. All the Administrative Departments concerned / Districts Collectors are therefore requested to take necessary action accordingly.

k) Residence Certificate of parents for stay in the state of A.P. from Tahshildar in case of candidates, who have studied outside A.P./ carried out private study.

l) Migration certificate (for other University candidates)

8.6 The cases of pending revaluation will not be considered.

8.7 After the announcement of the results, qualified candidates will be called for the certificate verification to assess the eligibility and other credentials. After the completion of certificate verification, eligible candidates are allowed to exercise their options (such as course of preference, college, type of seat etc.,) through online mode. The last date for exercising web-based options will be intimated to the candidate at www.yvudoa.in. After the last date, provisional seat allotment to the candidates will be given based on the availability of seats and by following the rule of reservation. After the provisional seat allotment candidates need to pay the required fee before the stipulated time to get the confirmed allotment letter. If any candidate(s) failed to pay the fee, the seat will be cancelled and it is treated as vacancy and will be filled in successive counselings.

9. LOCAL AND NON-LOCAL CANDIDATES

9.1 The Y.V.University area comprises of the districts Anantapur, Chittoor, Kadapa, Kurnool & Nellore.

9.2 The following candidates are treated as local to Yogi Vemana University area

9.2.1 A candidate who has studied in the Yogi Vemana University area (or stayed in case of private study) for four consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which he/she has first appeared for the final year qualifying examination.

9.2.2. A candidate who has studied (or stayed in case of private study) for seven consecutive academic years within the state of Andhra Pradesh ending with the academic year in which he/she first appeared for the final year qualifying examination and studied (or stayed in case of private study) for a maximum period in the Yogi Vemana University area.

9.2.3. In case a candidate has studied (or stayed in case of private study) for equal periods in the Y.V.University area and another University area out of the last seven years, he/she should have studied (or stayed in case of private study) lastly in the Yogi Vemana University area.

9.3 Any candidate who is not local to Yogi Vemana University is treated as non-local to Yogi Vemana University, if

9.3.1 he/she is local to any other University in Andhra Pradesh/Telangana State.

9.3.2 he/she resided for a total period of not less than 10 years in Andhra Pradesh/Telangana (excluding the periods of study outside the Andhra Pradesh/Telangana State).

9.3.3 His/her parents has resided in Andhra Pradesh/Telangana for a total period of not less than 10 years.

9.3.4 His/her parent/spouse is presently working in Andhra Pradesh/Telangana in government or allied service.

10. ALLOCATION OF SEATS TO VARIOUS RESERVATION CATEGORIES

10.1 Among the seats sanctioned in each course, 85% of the seats are given to reserved categories of local (L) candidates, while 15% are given to local and non-local candidates (L/NL) on merit. The 85% reserved seats are filled by local candidates belonging to OC (Open Category), SC (15%), ST(6%), BC-A(7%), BC-B(10%), BC-C(1%), BC-D(7%), BC-E (4%), ECA (Extracurricular activities): NCC/NSS/Sports/Cultural Activities (4%), PH (Physically handicapped) (3%) and CAP (Children of armed personnel) (2%).

At any cost total number of candidates admitted under non-local category should not exceed 15% putting together in all categories of OC, SC, ST, BC, ECA, CAP and PH. However, filling up of 15% of seats with Non-local candidates is not a must in case of non-availability of such candidates.

10.2 A vacancy under SC goes to ST and vice-versa. If enough SC&ST candidates are not available, the left-over seats reserved for them shall be treated unreserved seats and shall be filled by candidates of general pool.

10.3 25% of seats shall be reserved for the candidates belonging to the Backward Classes and shall be allocated among the following groups of Backward Classes as shown below:

GROUP 'A'(7%), GROUP 'B' (10%), GROUP 'C'(1%), GROUP 'D' (7%) and GROUP 'E'(4%)

If qualified candidates belonging to Backward Class of a particular group are not available, the leftover seats can be adjusted for the candidates of next group. If qualified candidates belonging to Backward Classes are not available to fill up the 25% seats reserved for them, the left over seats shall be treated as unreserved and shall be filled up with candidates of General Pool.

No candidates seeking reservation for admission under above categories be allowed to participate, in the Counseling for admission unless he/she produces the Integrated Community Certificated prescribed by the Govt. and issued by the Revenue Authorities in the Government (vide G.O. MS. No:58, Social Welfare (J), Dept., Dated: 12-5-1997).

10.4 For admission into Extracurricular Activities (ECA) seats, participation during the period of study of the qualifying examination is alone considered. The priorities in respect of the special categories mentioned above shall be in accordance with Government Orders issued from time to time.

10.5 Expert committees nominated by the University will certify the suitability and priority of the candidates under special categories (ECA/PH/CAP).

10.6 **Reservation for women:** One third of the seats are reserved for women candidates in each category (i.e., OC, SC, ST, BC, ECA, PH and L/NL). This rule is not applied if women candidates selected on merit in a category form one third or more of the seats therein. If there are no suitable women candidates in a category, the seats will be directed to the men candidates of the same category. Absence of adequate number of women candidates in a category cannot be compensated by giving more seats for women in another category.

11. **BC-C (1%) SEATS**

BC-C allotment will be done taking into consideration of the total seats available in all the subjects put together under college by adopting rotation system.

12. **SPONSORED (SP) SEATS**

YV University College (To be paid at the time of admission. No need to pay in second year) M. Sc. Organic Chemistry – Rs.70,000. Admission under sponsored seats will be done simultaneously along with regular and SF seats. Candidates are advised to come prepared with necessary fee.

13. **FEE PARTICULARS**

The details of fee to be paid at the time of admission for various PG courses are given in the following table. OC-fee means fee for general category without admissible income for fee reimbursement. Admission fee for income certificate holders means fee for candidates who are eligible for fee reimbursement under SC/ST category whose parents' annual income is less than Rs.2,00,000/- and for BC/OC candidates whose parents' annual income is less than Rs.1,00,000/-

If any admitted candidate(s) who cannot get fee reimbursement from the Government he/she has to pay the specified fee to the University immediately, as agreed earlier. In case if government will not reimburse the equivalent fee as specified above, the candidate has to pay the balance fee to the University, as agreed earlier.

Each admitted candidate has to pay an additional amount of Rs.400/- (Rs.200/- for SC/ST) towards counseling fee.

Other University students have to pay an additional fee of Rs. 250/-.

Income certificate of parent must be taken from Tahsildar in the year 2016.

Computer lab fee of Rs.1,000/- extra for, Economics, and M. Com. courses.
